Sinking Fund revenues are dedicated to making infrastructure improvements and repairs to school district facilities. These funds are to be used only for capital improvements.

A Sinking Fund in the District eliminates borrowing and interest costs to maximize taxpayer dollars. This proposal is for a time period of 5 years.

How have past sinking funds been used in district improvements?

FACT

If approved, this proposal would revert the sinking fund millage to the same rate the voters approved in 2019. FACT The sinking fund is subject to public reporting and disclosure requirements, so the public knows how the money is being spent.

What is a "mill"?

3.0 mills would generate approximately \$850,000 each year for 5 years. Here is how it would look:
