Band Fees

It is the student's responsibility to purchase items needed to play their instrument; reeds, oils, cork grease, etc. These items are not stocked at the high school bandhall, but can be found online via musical stores and Amazon. Throughout the year, students may be charged for various items such as UIL gear, show shirts, individual contest cancellation fees, non-returned band books, etc. These fees are billed to students through Skyward Family Access - using the Fee Management. Please be aware that any fees not collected by the end of each semester will prevent your child from being exempt from semester exams.

What is the Barbers Hill Band Booster Club?

The Barbers Hill Band Booster Club is the parent and community support organization for the band and color guard. The main purpose of this organization is to help the band directors and students achieve their goals as a performance group. The booster club provides the extra support, both financial and volunteer, that the band needs to compete at the highest level. Does Marching Band Require a Physical?

YES - If your child is in athletics, band, cheer or dance, they will need a physical. It is your responsibility to provide a copy to each coach, but you only need one original. Rank One Fine Arts and Rank One Athletics are separate platforms, so you will have to complete online participation forms twice. The physical form is available on the Fine Arts website, and must be dated after May 1, 2024 to be valid for the 24-25 school year. Incoming Freshmen will not have access to Rank One until mid-July.

What is the structure of the band?

A student's placement in the competitive marching show is determined by tryouts in the fall. During the fall semester (marching season) all of these students meet together for rehearsals after school. During the school day, each member will rehearse with their assigned instrument family during their assigned class period (percussion, brass, woodwind, guard).

In the spring, each group will meet during their assigned class time, based on fall tryouts (Concert Band, Symphonic Band, Wind Ensemble). The difference being that percussion students will now meet with their assigned band instead of as a percussion class.

What is Color Guard?

The Color Guard is an integral part of the visual performance of the marching show. Selection is based on tryouts at the end of the 2nd semester in the spring. The Color Guard augments the marching show by incorporating flags, rifles, and a variety of props. The group is under the direction of the Guard Director, Nathan Ascano. The Guard calendar is on the Guard section of the Fine Arts website.

What is Summer Band Camp?

Summer band camp is very similar to football and volleyball camps at BHHS. Attendance is required and decisions on Varsity, JV, and alternates. These decisions are based on attitude, ability, and attendance. Summer band is all about learning the band's marching show playbook-music and drill. UIL rules dictate when a high school program can begin working on the marching drill. The schedule has been distributed to students, and is posted on the Fine Arts website. Freshmen Camp begins July 22nd and we will be on campus all day! **The last page of this guide has helpful information for summer rehearsal.**

Will the band know the entire show by the first football game?

No. Our shows are very intricate with many parts. Each week of the marching season you will notice new parts and/or additional choreography. After the first three or four games the basic outline of the show will be complete but the directors will continue to "fill in" and add choreography and more interest.

Does the band perform at pep rallies?

Pep rallies are held during the last class period of the school day for home football games. In the 2018-2019 school year, the district updated the rules regarding guests at pep rallies. Due to security reasons and space limitations, parents are not allowed to attend pep rallies. When your child is a senior, you will have the opportunity to attend one pep rally.

Does every band member march in the show?

No, but everyone is expected to attend and perform in the stands at the football games and assist as needed at performances. All Varsity positions in the UIL Competitive Show will be determined by attendance during summer band, tryouts, and overall attitude. The varsity marching positions will be assigned by the directors during summer band camp after they have had the opportunity to watch the students march and listen to them play their show music. The members who are not assigned a Varsity marching spot will be assigned as Varsity Shadows, or JV members. JV members will assist with props and be assigned other duties during the performances if they are not promoted into the show at some point.

JV and Varsity Shadows are allowed to challenge for marching spots. JV members that do not earn a spot will be utilized to handle props on the field when props are introduced into the show. When a band member can't march because he/she is ill, he/she becomes ineligible because of low grades, or for any other reason, a director may use a shadow or JV member to replace them on the field. Varsity shadows and JV may not be required to attend every rehearsal once school starts but are required to attend all of the summer band.

Football Games

On most Fridays from the end of August until the beginning of November, there will be a football game. The students will be given a set time to meet in the band hall. On away games, the district provides a meal for band students, as they are typically not allowed to go home after school due to bus departure times. On home games, it is your responsibility to feed your student. Game day logistics are sent home with students and posted in Parent Square.

The end of the football game does not mean the band is released. At the end of a game, the band waits until the stands are almost empty before returning to the band hall. If you've never seen the official band dismissal, you are welcome to wait in the stands also. Once in the band hall, all uniforms and equipment is neatly stored. If you are picking up your band student please be very patient. This is one of the hardest things for the new band parents to understand.

Students are expected to travel to/from games with the band. They are allowed to leave with a parent or guardian, if the Alternate Travel Request has been completed in advance and can only be released after the game or at the end of a contest. Students must be checked out at the buses only. More information in the full band handbook.

What if the football team makes the playoffs?

If the football team makes the playoffs, the band is expected to play at the games. The schedule for these games will be different from the regular season so watch for directions to come from the band directors.

What if it rains at a football game?

Rain gear is provided for the band members during a game or competition. The band is expected to attend the game even if it's raining. The district safety regulations are in effect so if lightning is detected, the game will be delayed, paused, rescheduled, or called complete.

What is the Winter Guard?

Winter Guard refers to the competition season for the Color Guard that follows the Marching season. These contests are held indoors and separate routines for groups as well as individuals are learned and performed.

Are private lessons required?

Private lessons are not required, but strongly recommended. They are offered on every instrument, pending instructor availability and are conducted at the HS Band Hall. A deposit is required in advance of scheduling lessons. Contact hope.novosad@bhisd.net, if you are interested in private lessons. Students that are wanting to be in the top group in the Spring (Wind Ensemble) are expected to take lessons.

Our instructors are professional players or advanced-level university students who are contracted through BHISD. The lessons are \$25 per 30-minute session. Students with the benefits of private lessons not only elevate their own play but the musicality of the band as a whole.

What are Marching Contests?

Besides football games, the fall is all about the marching competitions for the BH Band. These competitions are held on Saturdays. They consist of UIL and other marching competitions. Most of the competitions are in the Houston area, with the UIL State competition held in San Antonio, if we are selected.

The 2024 dates for Class 5A are November 4 - 6, 2024, and we compete in Region 19. The district excuses the absence of our students from class and pays many of the expenses for a State trip. You can find more information on the UIL website: www.uiltexas.org.

For the local contests, the students will meet at the band hall at an instructed time, they will possibly rehearse, and then load the buses to travel to the competition site. Many competitions have a preliminary contest; they announce winners; and then have a finals competition for those bands that qualify. After the final awards are announced, the band will reload the buses and return to the band hall.

This all means very long days for our band kids! Hydration and nutrition are always a top consideration. You will be notified when a sack meal needs to be sent or if a meal is being provided. It is truly amazing to see what it takes to put on one of these shows and to see how amazing our students are. You will have a newfound respect for your student and how hard he/she works.

What is the Concert Season?

Concert season takes place mostly in the spring semester but begins immediately following the marching season. Concert season is the time when most musical training takes place and each band's performance rating during the UIL concert contest is the basis for evaluating the entire band program. Band members will be placed in a band based on the number of students and their playing abilities.

Tryouts for the Spring Bands are held in late fall. Those tryouts will be on the all region music and selected etudes. That music will be available in August and the performance of this music along with student's attitude, attendance, work ethic and dependability will determine placement in the Spring Band classes. Concerts and UIL Contests are held throughout the spring semester for all bands. Extra rehearsals, sectionals and performances will be required for this group. Students will be expected to maintain the highest standards of performance, effort, and discipline and adhere to the BHHS dress code at all times.

What are All-Region, Area, & State tryouts? (OPTIONAL)

Individual band members of the Wind Ensemble and the Symphonic bands are required to try out and members of the concert band are strongly encouraged to try out. Pre-selected tryout music is available to all students beginning in July. Region Concert Band tryouts are usually held in November & December in two phases. The students passing the first round (consisting of two phases) of tryouts will perform with the All-Region band. If a student passes the second round they attain area status and therefore are eligible to compete for the All-State band. This competition is usually held in early January.

Band members who become All-State musicians assemble in San Antonio in February to perform at the Texas Music Educators Association convention. The bands and orchestras made up of these wonderful musicians represent the top 1/2 of 1% of the high school band members in the state of Texas. Advancing to All-State is the highest individual honor a high school musician can achieve.

What are UIL Solo & Ensemble Contests? (REQUIRED)

This contest gives the band students another opportunity to progress musically. Participation in this event is not mandatory for any band member but it is highly encouraged. The contest is usually held in February. Each member will choose a piece of music with his/her lesson teacher that is appropriate to their level of play. The students are given a rating of I-V, I being the highest level. If a student chooses a piece of music from an approved list, performs that piece from memory, and receives a rating of I, that student will have the option of progressing to the State UIL Solo & Ensemble competition, usually Memorial Day weekend, in Austin.

What is the UIL Concert & Sight-Reading Evaluation? (REQUIRED)

The UIL Concert Evaluations are held in April. These competing bands travel to a local high school where they perform and are critiqued and graded by UIL judges. Each band performs their concert music followed by the sight-reading portion of the evaluation. If you have never been to this event, you will be amazed during sight-reading.

The band is given music that neither they nor the directors have seen or heard and have approximately 8-10 minutes to talk their way through the piece. They then receive a “one-time-shot” at their performance. These contests are open to the public and are fascinating to watch.

Summer Marching Rehearsal

- Our rehearsal uniform is black shorts and white t-shirts; not provided by the school.
- Students should wear athletic style shoes. (low top shoes)
 - Under no circumstance should a student come to marching rehearsal in Crocs, flip-flops, sandals, Converse, Vans, etc.
- Sunglasses and a hat are highly recommended.
- Students should put on sunscreen prior to rehearsal.
- Stay hydrated!
 - It is REQUIRED that students bring water to every rehearsal. A Camelback or a water jug/bottle of water tethered to a strap that you can sling over your shoulder, is preferred.
 - A single 16 ounce bottle of water is not enough!
 - Breaks will be provided, but drink water before and after rehearsal
 - Sodas and energy drinks are strongly discouraged
- Eat breakfast each morning!
 - Give your body some calories to burn so that you don't crash.
 - Protein and complex ("slow") carbohydrates are suggested versus donuts.
- Boosters will provide an opportunity to pre-order/pay for summer band lunch. If you miss that information, please contact bhbandbc@gmail.com, to make arrangements. Students are welcome to bring their own food, but leaving campus for lunch is not allowed.
- All football players report for band until football practice starts in August. Once football begins, go to football practice and come to band rehearsal only when you do not have football practice.

Every effort is made to minimize summer rehearsal time. PLEASE schedule vacations and trips away from these dates.
