Foundations in Early Education is designed to develop the skills necessary to work in the early education and the education industry sectors. The program studies the growth and development patterns of children from prenatal through adolescence including physical, cognitive, language, social, and emotional growth and developments as well as the influence of family, peers, school/childcare, media, community and culture, on children.



The Structure of the Program Includes:

- Open Entry-Open Exit (monthly)
- 26 week program-32 hours per week (832 hours total)
- Site placement working with children ages birth to three years old.

 - Negative tuberculosis test
 - Pertussis vaccination(Tdap)
 - Measles (MMR immunization)
 - Influenza, Covid vaccinations or exemption status
