PLEASE NOTE: All late testing exams for both Irondale High School and Mounds View High School students will be administered at the high schools or Mounds View Community Center located at 5394 Edgewood Drive, Mounds View. For late exams on Friday, May 23rd students will need to provide their own transportation as this is a non school day.

Policies for administering Late AP Exams

Occasionally, circumstances make it necessary for students to test during the alternate late testing schedule. To preserve the security of AP exams, alternate forms are used for this testing. All students who participate in late testing at a given school must take these alternate exams on the scheduled late testing dates and times above. All late testing exams will be in the same format as the regular testing window.

Late Testing Circumstances	
Below are circumstances when late testing is allowed by College Board without incurring an additional fee:	
Academic contest/event Athletic contest/event Disabilities accommodation issues High school graduation Language lab scheduling conflict Religious holiday/observance Strike/labor conflict	Conflict with International Baccalaureate (IB) or Cambridge exam Conflict with nationally, province, or state-mandated test Emergency: serious injury, illness, or family tragedy School closing: election, national holiday, or natural disaster Two AP exams on the same date at the same time Emergency: bomb scare or fire alarm Student court appearance
Additional circumstances that will incur an additional College Board fee of \$40 per exam are usually when schools or students have a choice between accepting the regular scheduled testing date and requesting an alternate date for testing.	

Other things you should know about exams taken during the late testing schedule:

- ~ Alternate late exams are equivalent in depth and difficulty to the regularly scheduled exams.
- ~ **Students' scores may be delayed up to one month (until August).**
