

Dual Enrollment at GGC



What is dual enrollment at GGC?

Dual Enrollment is your opportunity to get an early start on college by taking college classes part- or full-time while earning your high school diploma.

How do I qualify?

You must be a high school junior or senior of age 16 or older by the first day of your enrollment term, and meet the following requirements:

- 3.25 GPA based on grades in the 17 units of Required High School Curriculum (RHSC)
- Complete RHSC course units on schedule.
- Submit one of these accepted standardized testing options:
 - **SAT** – Evidence-Based Reading and Writing: 500/Math: 510/ Combined total score of 1050 (ERW + Math)
 - **ACT** – English 21 or Reading: 21/Math: 20/Composite score: 20
 - **ACCUPLACER** – Reading: 237/Writeplacer: 4/Quantitative Reasoning, Algebra, & Statistics 266

How do I apply for DE funding?

Funding for dual enrollment covers tuition for approved courses, as well as mandatory fees, and required textbooks. Complete your funding application through the Georgia Student Finance Commission at Gafutures.org.

How do I apply to GGC?

1. Meet with your high school counselor.
2. Apply to GGC free using promo code DE2023 at www.ggc.edu/apply. Semester deadlines are May 2 for fall, January 6 for spring and April 4 for summer.
3. Send official high school transcripts through Gafutures.org, and SAT and/or ACT scores to GGC through CollegeBoard.org or ACT.org. ACCUPLACER is offered at GGC's Testing Services.
4. Once accepted, an email with your next steps to include orientation registration will be sent. (Class registration and advisement)
