Dual Enrollment Requirements



- Student must be entering their 11th or 12th grade year.
 - A student interested in our cadet program must be at least 17 years of age at the time of enrollment.
- Student must speak with their high school counselor about the courses they may take at UNG that will count toward high school graduation. Courses must come from the approved course directory found at www.gafutures.org.
- Student must present a cumulative grade point average of 3.25 or better in their Required High School Curriculum (RHSC) coursework.
- Student must meet the minimum test score requirements on the SAT, ACT, PSAT*, PreACT*, or ACCUPLACER.
 - SAT (after March 2016): 530 Reading & Writing, 480 Math.
 - ACT: 20 English or Reading, 18 Math
 - PSAT: 480 Reading & Writing, 440 Math
 - PreACT: 20 English or Reading, 18 Math
 - ACCUPLACER: 4 Writeplacer, 243 Reading, and 266 Math
- Student must enroll in a bachelor's degree program at UNG

SATISFACTORY ACADEMIC PROGRESS

Once accepted and enrolled, the student must maintain a 2.5 college GPA and complete 67% of all attempted classes to continue in the program each semester.

Students who earn a 2.0 to 2.49 overall GPA will have ONE semester to raise their overall college GPA to a minimum 2.5. Failure to earn an overall college GPA of 2.5 will result in dismissal from the program.

Any Dual Enrollment student who falls below a 2.0 overall college GPA will be dismissed from the program.
