(35%) Programming exercises, Technology content and End-of Unit Assessments will cover major technology concepts and 21st century skills all students should master to be successful. Larger term culminating projects and assessments will be assigned.



Keyboarding

Focus will be on learning and mastering of keyboarding skills on the Qwerty (standard) keyboard using Keyboarding without Tears software. Touch typing (not looking at the hands) and complete memorization of the keyboard is the objective of this unit and **self-paced** lessons. Keyboarding without tears tests and quizzes must be completed during class or ASH hours.

Processing/Presentations

Word processing features will be discussed enabling the student to confidently create quality documents with proper formatting in Google docs. Students will learn presentation concepts using Google Slides– developing slideshows for presenting information. Other projects will use Storyboardthat, green screen technology and online research.

Late Work Policy

Missing/late work will be entered into Campus as "Missing" (this will calculate the grade as a zero until it is updated). If an assignment is turned in more than one week late, half credit may be deducted. Assignments turned in more than two weeks late will receive a zero.

Coding using Javascript

Initial focus will cover the concepts of coding and creating programs and applications to create their own online video game. Students will be learning how to code in Javascript as well as design their own app prototype and experimenting with physical computing. .

<u>3D Printing/ Architecture</u> / Augmented Reality

3d printing software programs and Sketchup3D will be used to create Roman architecture, time capsule boxes and 3d printed objects. Augmented Reality concepts will be addressed with tour creation and videos.

Digital Citizenship

Students will focus on the ability to use technology responsibly. Topics of cyberbullying, digital etiquette and social responsibility in a digital world will be covered.
