During the 24-25 school year, all BSSD administration buildings, school buildings, and athletic facilities will be open for full-time use and instruction. The district provides instruction, technology, technology support, and student support services in any environment that would remain open. The option of full-time Eagles Academy will also be available for families that choose it.
