Mrs. Johnson highlighted proposed changes to forecasted line items in the five year forecast that will be recommended for approval at the November 27<sup>th</sup> meeting. Changes included slight increases in property tax revenue due to reappraisal, flat-line of income tax revenue for FY24, and re-allocation of state funding from unrestricted to restricted (but remained flat-lined). The Board reviewed forecasted cash balance compared to the cash balance benchmark and noted that additional revenue (property tax levy) would be needed in FY27.
