- Participating, as appropriate, in decisions relating to their student's education.
- Promoting positive use of their student's extracurricular time.
- Volunteering in their student's school.
- Staying informed about their student's education and communicating with the school by promptly reading and responding to notices, when necessary, from the school or the school district, either received by their student or by mail, and responding, as appropriate.
- Serving, to the extent possible, on decision making teams, or any other school advisory or policy groups that make an impact on their student's education.
- Providing a loving and caring environment, so that their student is ready and able to learn.

ACTIONS TO BE TAKEN BY THE TEACHER:

Edward K. Downing Elementary will...

- Provide high-quality curriculum and instruction in a supportive and effective learning environment.
- Engage and empower students in the necessary learning to meet and exceed student academic achievement standards.
- Hold parent/student STAAR sessions, data meetings, provide in-school tutoring, and ensure that quality professional development sessions are provided to all.
- Plan and deliver instruction in a way that motivates and encourages all students to learn and grow.
- Explain and discuss assignments so that students have a clear understanding of the objectives and expectations.
- Supply clear evaluations of student progress to students and their parents in a timely manner.

- Focus on communication between teachers and parents on an ongoing basis.
