Survey Results for the Online Conference

- **PURPOSE:** To evaluate the online K-12 Project Management Conference ("Summer Camp") conducted on June 21, 2024 for about 400 I.T. staff at school districts, charter schools, and county offices of education in California and beyond. How did we do? The input will help us improve our planning and execution of future conferences.
- SURVEY TIMEFRAME: June 24 July 8, 2024 (10 business days)
- # OF RESPONDENTS: 75 optionally named respondents (not anonymous) from 56 organizations (19% response rate)

- 3 A couple of the topics were not helpful or coherent
- 3 Definitely worth my time, but not the best user of my time.

 were some "boring" points on the beginners options (as I am a
 beginner in this) however one whole session was just about
 filling out a form and it felt slow and dragged.
- 3 It was engaging and welcoming in the beginning. There
 were some meetings that I felt that weren't that organized or it
 wasn't what I expected. It was nice to hear what other districts
 were using to innovate their team.
- 3 Overall, the sessions I attended were mostly informative, but I have some feedback on the last class. It felt like more of a sales pitch for a management program, which was different from what I expected. Additionally, one of the presenters seemed quite disinterested in the software he presented. Instead of useful information, it turned into more of a session where he expressed dissatisfaction with the software.

- 3 The only reason I selected the value that I did was because some of the topics/talks I attended were for some aspects of project management already, so I think it might be helpful to have a charter or something along of an abstract about what might be covered in the course available to us. The one or two sentence description was fine but if we could list out what aspects we're going to cover then the attendees would have a much more complete picture and understanding of the events they were choosing over others.
- 3 There was one part of a session that felt a little negative/illprepared and it took away from people being able to learn about Asana.
- 3 There were multiple events that I had to choose from to attend and wished that there could have been some duplications at a later time to attend.

I started with the beginner tracks because I would consider myself a beginner, but eventually switched to the intermediate/advanced and even those were relatively basic. I took the most notes from the last session I was in. I won't give it 1 star because I did get 2-3 tips, but it wasn't worth the full 8 hours for me, so I wouldn't necessarily recommend it to others.

There were 40 responses to this optional question, where many stated "N/A" or "Nothing to improve."



Here are the general themes submitted for improvements. Thank you for your feedback!

- Increase the conference by a day for more collaboration, discussion, and access to materials ("1
 Day is pretty jam-packed, and more time to collaborate and discuss would be helpful for returning
 Attendees.")
- Structure the conference so it's not full days ("One all day session is a bit much for me during EOY as it's my busiest time of year. Maybe it could be split over the course of two or three days?")
- Offer more advanced topics and deep dives ("Maybe some advanced topics for those of us who
 have attended in the past, or are a little more savvy in PM, but would like to get into some nittygritty detail discussion." "Even more strategies/tips on real world application of project
 management concepts. I'd even like more in-depth Project Management Software
 demos/setups/tips & tricks. A deep dive into Monday.com, for example.")
- Bring back discussion-based sessions with breakouts ("Breakout sessions where I can meet other participants.")
- Discuss AI in more depth ("Add a focused pathway for AI tools, maybe? Everything was great so this is all I could suggest.")
- Create a track for CTOs and Tech Directors ("Create one geared towards administrators so they understand the need for project management.")
- Increase interactions ("I love when we can be interactive with the training. I would say even just at
 the beginning and end to have something that we interact with makes things feel more engaging."
 "More interactive engagement like the previous Super Mario World conference and games.")
- Consolidate all of the links used throughout sessions ("Links, Links, Links seems like we got a lot of information without them and had to go back into my email to find them again.")
- Ensure speaker readiness ("Do a run-through with speakers to ensure their presentation is up to par or to give feedback beforehand. I enjoy speakers who engage with the audience or who don't seem like they are reading off of a PowerPoint." "Making sure slides, links, or videos were working before presenting.")

29. Please mark the ways you saw or heard the conference advertised.

This information is especially useful for the SDCOE EPMO team to best understand how to advertise the conference in the future. Comments about having an online/virtual conference next year:

75

- "I think the option for Virtual and separate in-person is interesting. My understanding is this Conference materialized as a Virtual Conference, and SDCOE is far ahead at perfecting this. I believe the Virtual aspect is the greatest asset to allow for the most collaboration, and involvement.
- "Due to our district's budget restriction, I am hoping for a virtual conference."
- "I loved the virtual aspect on this. It was way more convenient, and I know an organization runs the risk of spotty attendance and interest from attendees but this conference was great. It was fun and had good content."

- "I really like the fact that it is virtual because it makes it easier to participate."
- "I think you are all nailing this, and should absolutely keep this going, and continue the conference to be as accessible and beneficial (Knowledge/Collaboration Opportunities) as possible."
- "Keep the virtual!:)"
- "Last year's conference had a MASSIVE Production value, and I felt that was lacking this year. Any steps closer to last year's conference (multi-day and Production Value/Sets/etc.) would be fantastic in future conferences."
 - Evaluator Comment: This is true for the online conference. We narrowed our scope for the online conference in terms of cost, and invested a bit more in the in-person conference in terms of materials and production.
- "Virtual allow for access for users from other districts with limited budgets. Next year's budget might be limited."
- "Virtual one went really well. You've certainly developed a critical mass across the state and it is
 exciting to see how organizations will benefit from these methodologies. My district certainly has
 by nature of our technology department using them."
- "Virtual please! It makes it easier for me to attend:)"
- "Virtual was really nice because I did not have to go through the hassle of having to get my district to reimburse me and I could do it anywhere! In person would be nice because it would be easier to network and meet others in the field."
- "Virtual would be easier to attend."

Comments about having an in person conference next year:

- "I prefer in person but it's more difficult to get approval."
- "I'd prefer it to be in person vs virtual."
- "Why does in-person cost money to attend but virtual doesn't?"
 Evaluator Comment: In-person events have costs like venue rental, table/chair/equipment rental, wi-fi costs, food and labor costs, parking costs, and print costs. Of those, the venue and food costs are the highest.

Additional input about next year:

Suggested Topics/Content

- "Demonstrations/Overviews of Different Project Management Software- Presentations would be done by users (Districts) of the product instead of vendor demos."
- "Having more advanced topics/discussions"
- "I did enjoy the track system and feel that definitely has a
 place in a conference like this. Please keep that going! Based
 on the amount of attendees and sessions offered, it may be
 beneficial to host a two-day online conference to be able to
 provide additional sessions and allow those who want to
 attend a beginner/advanced track an additional opportunity
 to also join some LEA share outs on the following day."
- "I did notice less content this year for the virtual side. I would like to see more content if I can't be there in-person."
- "I liked being able to share use cases that we have taken and applied from the various trainings this year. Also, participants requested any templates that we created to share as resources."



- "I look forward to participating next year! I think next year could be interesting to explore the PMI approach to Agile. I would be happy to present on it, with aspects like the Agile Manifesto, the difference between iterative and incremental approaches, Kanban versus Scrum, etc. Also, it could be interesting to extend the conference beyond IT, either with a few speakers and/or with opening the conference to new groups of attendees. I think there could be some really interesting applications from other education areas that would both benefit from the concepts and also spur new ideas for those within IT who may not have thought about how they could apply PM in new ways."
- "I loved the one activity we did live where we shared projects that we recently accomplished and allowed people from other LEAs to connect directly with them."

 Evaluator Comment: This is in reference to the K-12 Project Management Symposium held at the ComicCon Museum in San Diego in October 2024.
- "I'd love to see some discussion about doing Project Management within ticket systems. I don't believe SDCOE does this, but perhaps you have considered an integration or could elaborate on the workflow. For instance, how much task tracking is completed within the PM interface, vs e-mail or other systems."
- "It's good you introduced a variety of tools, even the super simple one, a spreadsheet or document with a list of tasks and owner of each."
- "Managing vendors"
- "Perhaps a deep dive into the different PM programs."
- "Topics including PMO and portfolio practices, working with absent stakeholders or sponsors, and other advanced topics with more detail would be helpful."
- "Virtual games that require you to look at the game master's screen and then switch to yours put people with a single puny monitor in a disadvantage." :) Evaluator Comment: This is in reference to Game Time at lunch.

Suggested Scheduling/Dates:

• "A lot more of my team may have come, but being on a Friday, and with the Wednesday holiday, we had a lot of our office take the day off. I think most everyone who was working that day attended. Hard to guess/schedule these kinds of things, but I wish more of my team could've made it."

Suggested Length of Sessions

- "Consider having longer sessions for certain topics to allow more time for Q&A or to expand on the content being presented."
- "Loved the breaks in between the sessions, made me feel like I was really there even if it was virtual"

Top 5 Reasons Why Conference Speakers Enjoyed Their Experience

1. Growth Opportunity

- "It was my first time presenting at a conference, and I learned a ton. I also learned that I have a lot of experience to gain and growing to do by continuing to do things like this."
