Message from Principal Wilkes

It has been an amazing start to the school year. Everyone including support staff, teachers, administrators, students, and parents has been working hard to prepare for a great first week of school. Thank you ALL for your efforts to start this school year strong.

This week, we have been holding class meetings and talking to your students about a number of topics. One of the things I shared with students was the Satisfaction Survey Results from last year. This included student, teacher, and parent surveys and how they drive our decisions to improve campus initiatives. We also discussed the new guidelines for student cell phone usage during school hours. Over the summer, we received feedback from parents and teachers regarding this growing concern. You may have also heard that other schools in our local area are completely banning cell phones on campus. At present, our expectations are that cell phones should not be used during class time and must be kept out of sight or placed in a designated container. The only exception for using a cell phone during class is if it is necessary for a specific assignment, such as creating a video or taking a picture, although this is not a common occurrence. Students will be allowed to use their phones during passing periods and lunch. We appreciate your support in this effort to remove distractions and focus student attention on subjects taught during class.
