### **Arrival/Dismissal Notes**

We had a great first week with extremely safe and orderly arrivals and dismissals. A big thanks to everyone for your patience as we work out the logistical kinks of getting everyone to the right place at the right time. In addition, it is clear that everyone has had a solid arrival and dismissal plan going into the week. Below are a couple notes to keep in mind that will make the process go even more smoothly and will help keep kids as safe as possible:

## Arrival / Hug & Go:

- 1. Remember, there is no outside supervision before 7:35. If you could plan to <u>arrive</u> <u>between 7:35 and 7:45</u>, it would be greatly appreciated. If your student is eating breakfast, they can arrive at 7:30.
- 2. When using the hug & go, <u>please pull forward as far as you can</u> regardless of the door your student uses. This will help get everyone in and out of the lot quickly.
- 3. It is important that <u>adults stay in the car</u> both for safety and efficiency reasons.
- 4. It is also important to have <u>students ready to get out the passenger side</u> of the vehicle as it is very unsafe to have students crossing between cars.
- 5. If you are walking students up, you should <u>drop off near the entrance of the parking lot</u> allowing students to walk to their door on their own. There are signs there indicating the drop-off location for walkers. Staff in yellow vests will be there to assist as needed. This helps both with safety as well as helping to instill confidence.

#### Dismissal:

- In grades K-2, teachers will look for the trusted adult who should be picking students up after school. Please <u>wait a distance away from the exit door</u> so that all students can get out of the building and teachers can safely keep track of them. Once eye contact is made, they will be released to go with you. In grades 3-5, students will be released out their exit door to come find you or walk/bike home.
- As long as students are with an adult and supervised, it is permissible to play on the main playground and/or fields for 15 minutes after school. However, after that time, our BASE program needs access to these spaces. <u>Please do not allow students to climb</u> <u>trees, fences, or run near the streets</u>.
- 3. Please talk to, or practice with students, the <u>safe uses of crosswalks</u>. Students and parents will be asked to use crosswalks and not cross in the middle of the street. Students should wait at the corner, make eye contact with the driver(s), and cross only when there is no moving traffic. Students should not cut diagonally across an intersection.

### Pets on School Property

In an effort to keep our school feeling safe for all students and families and in accordance with District Policy, only service animals and therapy dogs are permitted on school property. District Policy requires prior authorization from the principal to have a therapy dog on school property. We ask that all other pets remain on the perimeter of the school grounds before, during, and after school. We appreciate your cooperation with this request.

### **Pre-Arranged Absences:**

Now that we are all settling into the school routine, we wanted to take a minute to inform our new families and remind our returning families about attendance. Attending school each day and being on time to school are extremely important to a student's academic development and achievement. Every day a student is in school is an opportunity to learn, build relationships, and access needed support. Please take time to look at the <u>Meridian Attendance Information</u> <u>Handout</u>. The handout reviews excused vs. unexcused absences, making pre-arranged absences, state law as well as school and district policy. It also details ways in which parents

can help support positive attendance. As a reminder, a student will be considered excused based on the following:

- Doctor's note (shared with the front office)
- Religious holiday
- Absence required by the judicial system
- School sends student home (ie: health office sends home a sick student)
- Prearranged absence (<u>Pre-Arranged</u> <u>Absence Form</u> must be filled out and turned into front office prior to absence)

If you have any questions about attendance, please contact the main office.

#### Color Days:

In Kindergarten, students will kick off the 2nd week of school with color days. Kindergarten students are asked to dress in the following corresponding colors each day. If students in grades 1-5 would like to show support of our newest Mustangs, they are welcome to wear the colors each day as well.

<u>Mon 19th</u> - Blue Day <u>Tues 20th</u> - Green Day (not the band) <u>Wed 21st</u> - Red Day <u>Thurs 22nd</u> - Purple Day <u>Friday 23rd</u> - Favorite Color Day

**Fall Picture Day:** Our fall individual picture day is on Thursday, August 29. Picture forms went home today in your student's Friday Folder. You can pre-order picture packages now.
