

IB Rubrics

We have officially converted to IB grading practices. As part of this shift you will be seeing rubric grading. While a traditional letter grade has communicated a percentage of understanding, rubrics communicate a holistic look at achievement. IB provides the descriptor of student work that aligns with each level of achievement. (<u>IB descriptors linked here</u>)

A bit about rubric scoring:

- ★ There are 4 levels of achievement: Mastery, Proficient, Approaching, Beginning
- ★ Each level describes the student's **knowledge** and **application** of the <u>objective/standard</u> being assessed
- ★ The end goal is for students to demonstrate "Mastery" on assignments/activities/assessments
- ★ Minor mistakes do not diminish a students overall understanding of objectives/standards
- ★ A rubric score is NOT a % of accuracy, which is how a traditional grade is calculated

Teachers have been working to align assignments/activities/assessments with specific IB Objectives that are aligned to State Standards. As a result, what they are looking for as "Evidence Toward the Standard" is specifically spelled out for students in advance. The rubric helps align these expectations with a level of achievement.

For quick checks of understanding, the teacher may be using the following rubric:

Beginning (1-2)	Approaching (3-4)	Proficient (5-6)	Mastery (7)
Little to No understanding	Some understanding	Good understanding	Solid, clear understanding
(0)	Some mistakes / some confusion	Very few mistakes / Very little confusion	*expectation
Did not do / turn in			

You may be trying to calculate what this will look like "points" wise. **Don't**. We want you to rely on the IB Grade and Descriptor of student work to clearly understand your child's level of achievement. All that said, IB Grading does not align with a traditional grading system. As such, teachers have worked to align IB scores with a symbol (number) so that gradebooks accurately reflect a student's understanding. These correlations look like this:

IB Rubric Score	Gradebook Entry	
Mastery 7	95	
Proficient 6	88	
Proficient 5	85	
Approaching 4	78	
Approaching 3	75	
Beginning 2	68	
Beginning 1	65	
Did not do/turn in	50
