Homeless Shelter






Car, park, empty building, bus, or train station

## McKinney-Vento eligible students have the right to:


- Receive a free, appropriate public education.
- Enroll in school immediately, even if lacking documents normally required for enrollment.
- Enroll in school and attend classes while the school gathers needed documents.
- Enroll in the local school or continue attending their school of origin.
- Receive transportation to and from the school of origin, if requested.
- Receive educational services comparable to those provided to other students, according to the student's needs.



Each of the 20 Regional Education Service Centers has a designated Regional McKinney-Vento Liaison who provides technical assistance and training to Local Educational Agencies (LEAs).



TEA attributed lower identification in 2020-21 due to the COVID-19 pandemic. By 2022-23, Texas identification has increased by 23%, which mirrors pre-pandemic counts.
