

## FIRST-TIME GOAL SCORERS PROPEL SENIOR NIGHT GIRLS SOCCER VICTORY

You don't see too many high school "Senior Night" celebrations held in August, so if you're really going to commit to the concept, you better bring the heat.

Trust me: There was NO lack of heat at Cavalier Stadium Thursday night.

The Lady Cavalier soccer team posted its second consecutive 4-0 shutout victory, this time over a shorthanded Ripley squad, and a highlight reel of the contest would begin with the fact that NONE of Crockett County's goal-scorers had ever done it before in a varsity game – yet all three were seniors.

Two of them have spent their previous seasons in the defensive backfield, so they really haven't had many chances to get involved in the offense. The third didn't even play soccer before – and this was only her second game.

Oh, and another senior - goaltender Amaria Walker - was also just playing in her second game. And now she has two clean sheets (shutouts) to kick off her newest sport experience.

All this occurred on a night when the starting time for the contest was postponed for an hour due to the local heat index. The TSSAA has specific guidelines for what schools can and cannot do regarding locations that approach or exceed a 105-degree reading.

But once the game began, Lydia Waddey - relishing her newfound opportunity to make an occasional rush at a net - rammed in a shot from short range when she outran a defender and the Ripley goalie to a loose ball and drilled it into the net for her first career goal. And just for good measure, she added another one in the second half.

Not too long thereafter, senior Chayse Lewis steered a perfect lead pass into the middle of the box just as a charging Lanyah Cathey crashed the scene and nailed it into the netting for a 2-0 Crockett advantage. Cathey, a member of the Lady Cav basketball team, was playing just the second soccer game of her life.

In the second half, another Crockett senior whose previous play has been assigned to the defensive end of the field got on the scoreboard for the first time. Adalee Doyle made the boot, and Coach Carli Branson's kickers are off to a 2-0 start.

Lewis, Cathey, Waddey, and Stephanie Joyner all collected assists, and Walker only had to make two saves on the Lady Cav goal to keep Ripley scoreless.

Next week's games – both home affairs, vs. Augustine (Tuesday) and Huntingdon (Thursday) – should be tougher tests for Crockett and give Branson and assistants Joey Soriano and Jennie Agee a better idea of where the Lady Cavs stand as competitors.






