

UNDERSTANDING CREDITS

EARNING CREDIT

- 1 Semester Class = .5 credit
- 1 Yearlong Class = 1 credit (.5 earned per semester)

EACH SEMESTER IS INDEPENDENT

Example:

9th: Grade English/Language Arts

- Semester 1: 60% FAILED
- Semester 2: 80% PASSED

PROMOTION REQUIREMENTS



MAKING UP FAILED CLASSES

- Put class on schedule next year
- Summer School (Information around Spring Break)
- On-Line- Fulton Virtual School OR Fulton County Credit Recovery(FCCR)
- If a student fails a class and retakes the class, the new grade does not replace the failing grade.
 Grades for <u>all</u> attempted classes are shown on the transcript.

UNDERSTANDING GRADES

GRADING SCALE A (90-100) B (80-89) C (70-79) F (<70)</th>

7 additional points are added to a final grade of 70 or above in approved Honors, Advanced Placement (AP) courses, and Dual Enrollment Courses

> PROGRESS REPORTS: Distributed every 4.5 weeks

REPORT CARDS:

Distributed every 9 weeks

Final Grades: Semester grades earned in December and May

ACADEMIC PROGRAMS



- College level courses taken in high school and taught by a trained high school teacher.
- Must pass the AP exam with a 3-5 to earn college credit. Scores needed to earn credit varies by college.
- Courses taken 9th -12th grade.

ADVANCED LEVEL COURSES: Honors/Gifted Advanced Placement (AP)* College Courses(Dual Enrollment)*




- Grades 10-12 are eligible for Dual Enrollment
- Earn College Credit while still a high school student
- Courses are funded through the state of Georgia
- Students are allowed 30 semester hours/45 quarter hours at no charge

Seven (7) additional points are added at the end of each semester to passing grades in advanced level courses. *Student can receive college credit.

ACT REGISTRATION: <u>www.actstudent.org</u> * Please keep in mind most colleges will recommend you take the ACT plus Writing and not just the ACT alone. Test cost is \$93 with WRITING & NO WRITING is \$68.

- HOPE Grant is available at select two year and technical colleges—no minimum GPA is required.
- HOPE Scholarship is for eligible GA high school graduates that have a <u>3.0 core HOPE GPA</u> and earn credits in four rigor classes, that plan to attend a college or university in the state of Georgia. The HOPE Scholarship will cover part of the tuition cost of college.
- Zell Miller Scholarship is for eligible GA high school graduates that have a <u>3.7 core HOPE</u> <u>GPA, a score of 1200 on the SAT or a 26 composite score on the ACT, and that earn credit in</u> <u>four rigor classes</u>, who plan to attend a college or university in the state of Georgia. The Zell Miller Scholarship will cover all the tuition cost of college and can only be earned at the time of high school graduation.
- Access your HOPE GPA and review HOPE rigor, residency, and citizenship requirements (your valid social security number must be on file, prior to final eligibility by visiting GA Futures website: <u>www.gafutures.org</u>.
