- Students can register to attend the face-to-face session with college reps visiting GIA through Naviance.
- Pick up GOLD college visitation pass from the Counseling Center at least 1-day prior to the information session.
- Many sessions may last up to 45 minutes, and it
 is important for students to communicate with
 their teachers if a class will be missed to
 arrange for all work to be made up. You cannot
 attend a session that will make you miss a
 major assignment unless you have planned with
 your teacher WELL in advance.

- During junior and senior year, students can have three absences excused for college visits.
- Prior approval of teachers is required, and students may not excuse a day where a major assessment is being given.
- Must complete form below at least three days prior to college visit.
- Must provide an official letter on college letterhead upon return to have visit marked as excused.
- If student fails to complete all steps or if maximum days have been used, absence will be marked unexcused.

THE COLLEGE APPLICATION PROCESS

WHICH COLLEGE ADMISSION PROCESS BEST SUITS YOU?

Nonrestrictive Application Plans

Regular Decision

DEFINITION:

Students submit an application by a specified date and receive a decision in a clearly stated period of time.

COMMITMENT:

NONBINDING

Rolling Admission

DEFINITION:

Institutions review applications as they are submitted and render admission decisions throughout the admission cycle.

COMMITMENT:

NONBINDING

Early Action (EA)

DEFINITION:

Students apply early and receive a decision well in advance of the institution's regular response date.

COMMITMENT:

NONBINDING

Restrictive Application Plans

Early Decision (ED)

DEFINITION:

Students make a commitment to a first-choice institution where, if admitted they definitely will enroll. The application deadline and decision deadline occur early.

COMMITMENT:

BINDING

Restrictive Early Action (REA)

DEFINITION:

Students apply to an institution of preference and receive a decision early. They may be restricted from applying ED or EA or REA to other institutions. If offered enrollment, they have until May 1 to confirm.

COMMITMENT:

NONBINDING

Students are not restricted from applying to other institutions and have until May 1 to consider their options and confirm enrollment. Students are responsible for determining and following restrictions.

SENDING YOUR TRANSCRIPT REQUESTING RECOMMENDATIONS

SENDING TRANSCRIPT

- If you apply to a college using Common App, Black Common App, , or any other mass application website, a link will be sent directly to your counselor to process your request. DO NOT LIST ANYONE OTHER THAN YOUR ASSIGNED COUNSELOR ON THESE SITES. The person that you list will be responsible for sending all of your required documents and that is the job of your assigned school counselor (not administration, teachers, college coach, mentor, etc).
- Please list us as your assigned counselor and not advisor!
- If your school is not on Common App, use Scriborder to request your transcript using: https://fultonga.scriborder.com
- Ignoring these steps will delay or prevent your assigned counselor from sending this information to those that need it.

REQUESTING A LETTER OF RECOMMENDATION

- If you request a letter of recommendation using Common App, Black Common App, or any other mass application website, a link will we be sent directly to your teacher and/or counselor to process your request.
- PLEASE BE SURE TO SEND AN EMAIL OR SPEAK WITH YOUR
 TEACHERS, PRIOR TO SENDING THEM A REQUEST FROM THESE
 PLATFORMS. Failing to make a request prior to sending the link,
 might result in your teacher declining the request afterwards. Select
 recommenders that can speak highly of your academic ability.
- If the college has their own individual recommendation form, please follow instructions from the college and share the instructions with your recommenders (after requesting the recommendation).
- Students should give recommenders a minimum of 10 school days' notice prior to their application deadline (No later than September 30th for Early Action).
- Send a thank you email to your recommender. It takes a lot of time to write recommendations.



ACT REGISTRATION: www.actstudent.org * Please keep in mind most colleges will recommend you take the ACT plus Writing and not just the ACT alone. Test cost is \$93 with WRITING & NO WRITING is \$68.

APPLY FOR FAFSA

- A new, simplified Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) form was introduced this year. https://studentaid.gov/.
- Along with the easier-to-complete form, there'll be changes in how your aid is calculated.
- It is highly recommended that all families complete and submit the FAFSA. FAFSA will open October 2024.
- Many colleges and universities may require additional financial aid forms like the CSS Profile. Please check the requirements specific to the college you plan to attend after acceptance.



^{*}Please note that students that are USA citizens born to immigrant parents or students with permanent USA VISAs can receive financial aid.

- HOPE Grant is available at select two year and technical colleges no minimum GPA is required.
- HOPE Scholarship is for eligible GA high school graduates that have
 a 3.0 core HOPE GPA and earn credits in four rigor classes, that plan to
 attend a college or university in the state of Georgia. The HOPE
 Scholarship will cover part of the tuition cost of college.
- Zell Miller Scholarship is for eligible GA high school graduates that have a 3.7 core HOPE GPA, a score of 1200 on the SAT or a 26 composite score on the ACT, and that earn credit in four rigor classes, who plan to attend a college or university in the state of Georgia. The Zell Miller Scholarship will cover all the tuition cost of college and can only be earned at the time of high school graduation.
- Access your HOPE GPA and review HOPE rigor, residency, and citizenship requirements (your valid social security number must be on file, prior to final eligibility by visiting GA Futures website: www.gafutures.org.


