FACULTY SPOTLIGHT: JAY AND STEPHANIE GARVEY

Working as a team to shape the lives of Gow students

Six years ago, Jay and Stephanie Garvey moved to South Wales from Franklin Academy, a boarding school for students with autism in Connecticut. As integral members of the Gow community, Jay teaches English, and together Jay and Steph serve as athletic coaches and live in Green with their twins, Will and Sam. "I hope that, as dorm parents, we help create a family atmosphere where students feel welcome. It is amazing to get to know our students, and to see them make such significant progress here," said Jay.

In addition to teaching English, Jay has worked as a lacrosse and wrestling coach. Stephanie, an occupational therapist at a school in Buffalo, teaches handwriting at the Gow School Summer Program and coaches the Gow girls' volleyball team. "It is wonderful to see our students, many with the same story of academic difficulties, find and make lasting friendships with students who have shared experiences. They flourish here, and by graduation, I am amazed at how poised and confident they are," said Stephanie.

While Green Dorm has been home to high school girls for the past year, the Garveys will welcome Gow's youngest male students to Green this fall. As the Garveys have twin boys entering sixth grade, they are especially enthusiastic as they are already friends with many of the students. "We want to bring a family atmosphere to our dorm and to recreate more of what the students have at home, including pizza and movie nights, cookie making, and game nights. We are making some improvements to Green, and I think the boys will be excited about the upgrades," said Jay.

As avid sports fans and participants, the Garveys enjoy cheering for their sons' lacrosse, football, and basketball teams and attending Sabres, Bills, and Bandits games. Come fall, they look forward to sharing this hometown Buffalo team spirit with their new Green Dorm residents, too.


GOW ALUMNI SPOTLIGHT

IZER MARTINEZ '13









At Gow, Martinez excelled academically and thrived in a supportive environment that encouraged leadership and participation in extracurricular activities. He served as class president, captained the soccer, basketball, and lacrosse teams, participated in a poetry slam in Toronto, and regularly took on extra homework. He credits the Reconstructive Language program and his teachers for helping him overcome dyslexia. "I had the most supportive teachers, who made all the difference. At Gow, we became a family. My friends all had the same story of going to different schools, and we immediately connected and created a bond. They are still my closest friends today—friends for life," he shares.



"Gow prepared me not just for a career but for life. I learned from house jobs, from teachers who pushed me to excel, how to advocate for myself and the things I need to learn, and that I can create positive outcomes - skills I use daily."

After graduating from Gow, Martinez was named a Gates Millennium Scholar, an honor funded by the Gates Foundation that provides college and graduate school scholarships. He earned both his undergraduate and graduate degrees from the University of Pennsylvania. Following graduation, Izer explored diverse career paths, including acting on Chicago P.D. and working in music management, before finding his passion in venture capital. Today, he supports minority-owned startups and companies founded by people with dyslexia.

"I was given the gift of a Gow education, and hope that in the next 100 years, generations of students like me will benefit from everything Gow offers, including RL, amazing teachers, and the ability to advocate for themselves. I am profoundly grateful to Gow for changing my life," Martinez concludes.
