BILL HOKE '58

"I learned on my first day of classes at Gow, that there were other students just like me."

A native of Birmingham, MI, Bill Hoke '58 attended Gow for his junior and senior years. "I had a perfect Norman Rockwell childhood except for school. Every school year, I would tell myself I would

do better, try harder, and live up to the potential everyone said I had. Then I would crash and burn and my long-wondering parents would seek another alternative. Someone finally pointed us to Gow," Hoke recalled.

Following his two years at Gow where Bill got his "first 'A' in anything," he attended five colleges and universities, finishing at Oakland University where, although still struggling in the classroom, he was editor of the university newspaper. After graduating, he went into marketing and worked for 15 years in advertising agencies, including as creative director for major brands Boeing and Holland America. He and his wife, Patty, then started a boutique advertising agency with 18 employees that won numerous awards for medical and social advertising. Since retiring, he has worked as a teacher and mentor with more than 4,000 business start-ups.

BIll and Patty are devoted to the Pacific Northwest where they enjoy mountain climbing and long-distance hiking. Bill has self-published three books of mountain haiku and edited the "Olympic Mountains Trail Guide." Bill and Patty have a blended family of four and live on the Kitsap Peninsula. across the water from Seattle.

"I owe a lot to Gow and can honestly say the school saved me. I made life-long Govian friends who helped me understand and accept that I see and learn differently and can be successful. Thanks to Gow, I have come a long way since arriving on campus in September 1957!"

Beth is inspired by the vibrance of the Western New York art scene. "I am currently doing a residency in Buffalo, and love the depth of the





At our most recent Trustees meeting, the Board voted unanimously to begin construction on our ambitious Howard Hall Project to replace the Main Building. Since we began fundraising in 2021, generous donors have made gifts and pledges of more than \$8 million. We are thankful for your support!
