Faculty Focus LELAINA SULLIVAN '15

For Ms. Lelaina Sullivan '15 teaching Reconstructive Language and Public Speaking at Gow is a family affair. After attending The Gow School Summer Program (GSSP) for several summers, she came to Gow when it became coed and is one of Gow's first female graduates. Her father, Michael Sullivan, served as Director of Technology and started Gow's Robotics program. Her uncle, Adam, graduated in 1999, and her grandfather, Dan Sullivan, served as a Trustee.

"Being a student at Gow saved my life, and I am so grateful for the support I received," said Ms. Sullivan. After graduating from Gow in 2015, she earned a degree in Health and Risk Management with a minor in Public Relations from Ashland University in Ohio. After working as a GSSP counselor for four years, she became a faculty member in 2021. In addition to teaching, she serves as a dorm parent in Ellis and is a faculty advisor for Operation Hope, Gow's community service club. She is also earning her Master's in Special Education at Canisius College.

"Working at Gow enables me to give back. As a Govain, I understand our students' journey and want them to know that I support them. I am especially proud to see so many female students at Gow. When I started, I was one of six girls and now we have 32 girls, including a female president and vice president of the Student Council," added Ms. Sullivan.

"Thanks to my mom and dad and the support I received at Gow, I am where I am today. My goal is to encourage every student on their Gow journey so that they too can realize their potential and succeed."



With honesty, compassion, and a keen desire to help parents who find themselves with similar challenges, Mary Ann Coulson, a Gow parent, and former Trustee, chronicles her twenty-year journey as a mother and educational advocate for her son, Adam, who graduated from Gow in 2004.

From a young age, Adam was a talented artist who struggled with reading and writing. According to him, "The letters and words were moving all over the pages and I couldn't explain that to anyone."

After challenging years in different schools, they discovered Gow where Adam enjoyed "a total teenage experience," including skiing, soccer, crew, lacrosse, swimming, and becoming an Eagle Scout. For Adam, his Gow experience is defined by strong friendships, beloved teachers, Reconstructive Language, graduation from Gow, and two bachelor's degrees from The University of Cincinnati. With degrees in Architectural Engineering Technology and Construction Management, Adam works for the Kroger Corporation as a senior store designer and serves as a Gow Trustee.

In writing this book, Mary Ann seeks to give back. She hopes that their story and resource guides can inspire, comfort and help guide other families.

Mary Ann recently retired from management at Morgan Stanley. She and her husband, David, live in Niagara Falls, Ontario.

4 - Eric Davis '89 and his wife, Nancy, live in Vero Beach, FL, where he owns a fishing charter company.




5 - Soren Messner '98 works at the Brookings Institute in Washington, DC where he runs the digital and creative practice. Last summer, he and his family visited Toyko.

8 - Colin Mann '06 owns a forestry engineering company on Vancouver Island and enjoys mountain climbing in his spare time.




