# *Gow Alumni Spotlight:* **Peter Rosenthal '79**

Lifelong friends, mastering the rope tow and Ski Hill, exploring hidden places, and living in Green Dorm are just a few of Peter Rosenthal's fondest memories of his five years at Gow. Now a real estate developer and custom home builder in the San Francisco Bay Area, Peter credits his success in career and family to his days in South Wales.

Originally from Providence, Rhode Island, Peter had struggled at school before he arrived at Gow in the eighth grade. "Gow gave me confidence and showed me I could succeed. School was not easy for me, but by putting in hard work and energy, I learned how to get worthwhile results," he said. "Gow taught structure and good study habits. I enjoyed being around other students who were just like me, and discovered a thirst for learning new things that continues to this day."

Today, Peter is most grateful for his Gow friends and how they still support each other. "I run into Gow friends after years of not seeing them, and it is like no time has passed. I know I could call any friend from the '70s and we could pick right up where we left off," he said.

After leaving Gow, Peter received a degree in finance from Northeastern University and embarked on what he called a "portfolio career, I learned how to do a bit of everything." His career took him from Boston to New York before he settled in San Francisco. Peter held executive-level positions at a feature film company, a computer gaming company, and an internet startup before transitioning to real estate and eventually starting a construction and real estate development company. Peter and his wife, Patti, live in San Francisco with their son, Marty, who is in high school.

"I feel like being a developer uses both the business and artistic sides of my brain and I enjoy seeing the potential in my projects," he said. As the co-founder of Buzzer 9 Development, Peter now spends his days developing custom residential projects all across the San Francisco Bay Area.

"As I look back on Gow, I have nothing but fond memories for the school which helped transform me into who I am today. It was a terrific experience and my hope for the future is that all the kids playing in the woods of South Wales today realize what an opportunity and privilege it is to attend Gow. I am forever grateful to my friends, teachers, and the school."



## Todd Avis, Interim Director of Enrollment Management

With more than four decades of experience in teaching and academic administration, Todd has returned to Gow where he started his career. "For me, this is my happiest place. Gow means so much to me – as an educator, administrator, father, and husband. I love the Gow community and its commitment to 100 years of helping students who learn differently," he said.

From 1984 until 1992, Todd and his wife, Sandy, raised two of their three sons on campus while he served as a teacher, dorm parent, coach, Director of Student Affairs, and Director of Admissions. Todd then worked as Head of School at Hillsdale Academy in Hillsdale, MI, as Vice President for Curriculum and Teacher Development for an education management organization in Grand Rapids, MI, and since 2013, as CEO of the Leelanau Education Group, which runs the Tampa Day School.

After his wife passed away in 2022, Todd was offered an opportunity to come back to Gow to help promote and grow the school. "It's exciting to see how the campus facilities and programming have expanded, and all the opportunities for students outside of the classroom," he said. He prioritizes what he calls Gow's differentiators – Reconstructive Language, which he once taught, the balanced program, the structure of the education, and the focus on the whole student.

Todd said "When we help a family understand that Gow offers hope for their child and will give them the education they need, that is rewarding. Every day, I have a chance to promote Gow's superior faculty, beautiful campus, and opportunities that will give students the skills and confidence to realize their dreams. I can't imagine anything more meaningful."
