Overall, we have shown gains in performance on LEAP Assessments, ACT & Workkeys assessments, our overall graduation rate, and the earning of post-secondary credits and certifications. While a tremendous achievement, a School Performance Score can never truly encapsulate the true impact of the education provided at HHS. Counselors' Corner

Seniors, be sure to check the "Counselor" section under "Academics" on the HHS website for important college and scholarship information.

Senior parents: the counselors have begun meeting with all seniors to give them information about completing the FAFSA. The first step is to create an FSA ID for the student and one for the parent that will be completing the FAFSA with the student. The FAFSA application is being revamped so it will not open until some time in December. Be sure to complete the 2024-2025 application since that is when your student will attend college. Please review all of the important information your senior will be sent home with in order to successfully submit the FAFSA since it is a graduation requirement. We will have a FAFSA completion seminar for anyone needing assistance on Thursday, February 1, from 2pm-6pm on Parent/Teacher Conferences Day.

Attention Seniors! The 2023-2024 HHS Community Scholarship Application will be collected as a Google Form. Students can access the link on their Counselor's 12th Grade Google Classroom. Please take the time to complete the Google Form application thoroughly in order to best qualify for scholarships that will be presented during Junior/Senior awards night. You must submit the Google Form before Sunday, January 7th at 11:59pm to be considered for HHS Community Scholarships.

IMPORTANT: If you would like to be considered for any of the financial need based scholarships then you MUST select an income (\$0-200,000+). Failure to select any dollar amount of income will eliminate you from consideration for any need based community scholarships. Also, certain scholarships REQUIRE proof of community service. Please make sure you have documentation of ALL proof of your listed community service. YOU MUST BE READY TO PROVIDE THIS PROOF IMMEDIATELY IF SELECTED. Seniors, please submit a copy of any scholarship award letters or emails you received regardless if you accept them or not. This information is posted in the graduation program. You can submit also to Mrs. Kellie Tabor at ktabor@stcharles.k12.la.us

Parents, please know that planning for the scheduling of the next school year is in full swing. The counselors are working with students on completing their Individual Graduation Plans (IGPs) and determining the course requests for the next school year. It is always helpful when you take time to review the "Course Catalog" with your child and evaluate which electives he/she would like to take. This document can be found online under "Academics". These courses are also posted in the Counselors' Google Classrooms.

What Social-Emotional Skills Do Students Need Most?





HHS Families, are you aware of the ACT testing dates for this school year? Read below to plan opportunities for your student to test! All Juniors will be testing on March 7, 2023 here at HHS. Any Senior wishing to retest will also have the chance to sign up to test on that day as well. There are also national test dates for which students can register. Please reach out to your counselor for information about ACT scores and TOPS, Dual Enrollment, and scholarship opportunities.

Notice: In 1986 all asbestos materials were identified in all school buildings. A management plan was developed for each school as per the Asbestos Hazard Emergency Response Act (AHERA). The management plan is located in a binder in the main office of each school. The binders are available for review upon request.

Since the plan was developed, most of the asbestos has been removed. In a few buildings, some floor tile still remains that contains asbestos. All of the schools meet the health requirements that pertain to the regulation.
