Scholarship:

Scholarship applications/information for individual colleges in Louisiana as well as out of state schools are generally available in the counseling suite as soon as they arrive. Some colleges do not have a separate application. Most of the local scholarships are handled through the Destrehan Scholarship Committee. You will receive an application for those scholarships later this fall. Most scholarships require a good ACT score and GPA. While other may look at extra-curricular activities, volunteer work or special talents. **Be sure you meet the requirements before applying.**

TOPS University Diploma VS.TOPS Tech Career Diploma: NOW IS THE TIME TO DECIDE!

If you are in the **TOPS Tech University Diploma** curriculum and are considering a move to the **TOPS Tech Career Diploma** curriculum, Please See your Counselor . Moving to the **TOPS Tech Career Diploma** may require a schedule change for the spring semester. Remember, with the **TOPS Tech Career Diploma** curriculum, you must have an area of concentration which requires nine primary courses, one of which is Education for Careers.

JUNIOR YEAR IMPORTANT FOR TOPS!

Many of you are planning on getting the **TOPS scholarship** to help pay for college. Your junior year is critical in computing your TOPS GPA because so many of your TOPS courses (English III, Algebra II or Adv Math, Chemistry, U. S. History, your second foreign language, and possibly Fine Arts Survey (or Art, Music or Drama) are taken in your junior year. So, if your **TOPS GPA** is not near the required 2.5 GPA, your junior year is your opportunity to get some As and Bs in those classes to help bring up your TOPS GPA.
