ABOUT BROOKSTONE

Brookstone School was founded in 1951 as an independent, coeducational college preparatory day school. The campus is in a college-like setting located on 100 acres in northwest Columbus GA, 80 miles south of Atlanta. Brookstone has an enrollment of 826 students in 3k through 12 grades. The Upper School (ninth through twelfth grades) has 306 students and the Class of 2024 totals 85 students. Brookstone is accredited by the Southern Association of Independent Schools, Southern Association of Colleges and Schools, National Association for College Admission Counseling (NACAC), Southern Association of College Admission Counseling (SACAC), The College Board, National Association of Independent Schools (NAIS), Georgia Independent School Association (GISA), The Cum Laude Society, National Honor Society, Global Online Academy.

MISSION STATEMENT

Brookstone School, a college preparatory institution founded in the Judeo-Christian ethic and committed to academic excellence, endeavors to build in its students the core values of loyalty, courage, wisdom, honor, service, respect, and leadership.

CORE VALUES

Brookstone's core values – loyalty, courage, wisdom, honor, service, respect, and leadership – guide the educational program and daily interactions among students and adults. With a highly developed and intentional focus on servant leadership and character development, Brookstone prepares its students for lives of engagement and service to others.

HONOR CODE

A standard by which our lives are judged, our respect is earned and our work is validated. Brookstone holds a yearly honor assembly where each student pledges his honor. When a student pledges his/her honor on any assignment, this word is a guarantee of the originality and integrity of the work.

BEYOND THE CLASSROOM

- There are 29 athletic teams in the Upper School and 85% of Brookstone students play at least one sport.
- Brookstone offers an extensive program in visual arts, music and theater.

THE PREFECT SYSTEM

Brookstone Schools' primary leadership program. The Head and Deputy Prefects are outstanding juniors and seniors who are nominated or self-nominated and then selected by a faculty review board for their high character and exceptional integrity, leadership within and outside of the classroom, and commitment to the mission and core values of the school. Students may also serve in leadership positions as committee members on any of the Prefect committees under the leadership of the prefect and a faculty member.

BLANCHARD LEADERSHIP INSTITUTE

Blanchard Leadership Institute is an institute without walls, embedded across all divisions of Brookstone School and serving to help every Brookstone student, faculty and staff member become a deliberately developmental individual by utilizing proven methodologies developed by researchers at Harvard University. BLI helps students unlock their true potential as leaders, teaching them how to lead and how to serve while fostering growth together as an educational institution. Through BLI, Brookstone students are taken through an exercise called the The Developmental Sprint. It is designed to break down and analyze thought processes, behaviors, and emotions allowing participants to accelerate their own individual growth and gain what we call "Developmental Intelligence."

ADVANCED PLACEMENT

Brookstone School offers 14 Honor courses and 22 Advanced Placement courses. Students may only take AP courses after being accepted through an application process, which includes prior course performance, test scores and teacher approval. Students enrolled in Advanced Placement courses must take the AP Exam.

THE GRADING SYSTEM

Two 18-week semesters with examinations at the end of each semester make up the academic calendar. One averaged final grade is shown on the transcript. Brookstone uses a weighted academic GPA; Honor courses receive a 0.5 addition and AP Courses receive a 1.0 addition. Due to the small size of our senior classes, Brookstone does not provide a class rank.

GLOBAL ONLINE ACADEMY

The Global Online Academy (GOA) is a consortium of leading independent schools from around the world whose mission is to reimagine learning to empower students and education to thrive in a globally networked society. Juniors & Seniors may make a selection from the GOA course list. These courses may strengthen their academic program or can enhance/encourage a student's possible interest in a college major.

LINKCREW

A yearlong freshman program where members of the junior and senior classes act as positive role models to allow freshmen to discover what it takes to be successful both academically and socially. LinkCrew members begin their term of service by attending a three-day freshman orientation whereby they act as counselors and mentors. They continue their work by meeting monthly with the freshmen and overseeing their social and emotional needs through team building exercises.

SERVANT LEADERSHIP

Brookstone School strives to instill the values of servant leadership in every student by living out the attitude, "serving others, while developing as leaders". While each student is part of an "all school" volunteer day, students are also involved in service and leadership development through activities with clubs, organizations, athletics, and community service projects. They learn about our local and global community and how they can make an impact by developing relations and serving their community in a variety of ways. Brookstone hopes to prepare students to be engaged and active citizens through service and leadership.

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS & GPA EQUIVALENCY

The minimum program of study leading to graduation includes 22.5 credits. Seniors are required to participate in and complete all requirements for the Deliberate Life Program, which includes research, shadowing and a presentation.
