Cavalier Health

Health History

For everyone's health and safety, it is very important for our school nurses to be aware of each student's health history. Parents should thoroughly review and complete the Health History on SchoolMint.

When To Stay Home From School

A child kept home or sent home with a fever may not return to school until they are fever-free for 24 hours without the use of fever-reducing medications like Tylenol or Motrin. Children with vomiting or diarrhea should be kept home for 24 hours after symptoms have stopped.

Medication

Students cannot receive medication (Prescription or OTC) until parents fill out the Administration of Medication/Medical Procedure (form 7) located on the school website and in SchoolMint.

Students cannot carry medication (Prescription or OTC) and it must be kept in the school clinic. There is an exception for lifesaving, emergency medications like EpiPens or rescue inhalers.

The school does not provide medication including Tylenol and Benadryl.



The AP sequence:

AP Biology, AP Chemistry, AP Physics, AP Calculus BC, AP Computer Science Principles, AP Computer Science A, and AP Latin

Though we have not elected to offer all of our core curriculum in AP format, we have created a sequence of AP courses that students may begin to take in their sophomore year of high school. The six 'AP' offerings are a robust sequence for students who begin pursuing this route in 10th grade.

ACA's unique 0.5 credit requirements:

Composition (9th grade), Moral Philosophy (10th), A Survey of the Fine Arts (10th), Political Philosophy (11th), American Government (11th), and Lessons in Wonder (12th)

Humanities courses have historically been a strength at Atlanta Classical and we have recruited talented teachers in corresponding fields. This sequence of unique required courses ensures that students are close readers, nuanced thinkers, and excellent writers. These courses are essential to our aim of ordering the affections of our students.

Student Government Association



Atlanta Classical Academy's Student Government Association (SGA) is an institution of student leadership for students in 9th-12th grade. SGA exists "to foster our school culture, represent student sentiment, cultivate the school virtues, serve the local and school community, and promote school morale and camaraderie" (SGA Constitution Preamble).

Students vote their representatives and leaders into office after which they are responsible for representing student needs, concerns, and petitions to the school leadership. They are further responsible for organizing and hosting major school events such as Homecoming, Prom, service projects, and school-wide fundraisers.

Serving on student government is an honor as much as it is a weighty responsibility and a unique opportunity for students to grow their skill in leadership.

Fine Arts







Atlanta Classical's Fine Arts department is committed to ensuring that every ACA student has the opportunity to appreciate, perform, and create art of all kinds.

Students in grades 7-8 have a daily Fine Arts period built into their schedule and participate in their grade-level choir one day a week. The Cav Choir, made up of the entire 9th-10th grade classes, meet weekly during Cav Period. As a graduation requirement, students must take a Fine Arts connection class in 10th grade. All Upper School students may participate in a Fine Arts elective. This year, ACA is relaunching the Visual Arts Scholar Program for high school students desiring to dive deeper into specific areas of art instruction.

Athletics



Athletics at ACA provide opportunities for studentathletes to become virtuous citizens. Students and coaches set goals and adhere to them even when faced with obstacles. In order to try out for any sport at ACA, students must go through the following process:

- Register through MyPaymentsPlus to receive all relevant information and updates about tryouts.
 To create an account for MyPaymentsPlus visit mypaymentsplus.com/welcome
- Before tryouts, parents must complete all forms and waivers and have an updated GHSA physical on file through PRIVIT. For PRIVIT access, scan the QR code to the right. No hard copies of physicals will be accepted.
- NEW Policy: Physicals that expire during the season must be updated within 7 days of the expiration date. Players must have current physicals for the length of the season. Athletes will be pulled from practices and games if their physicals are not updated.





House System







The House System at ACA is for students in grades 6-8. Upon entering 6th grade, each student is sorted into one of four houses: Alexandria, Carthage, Constantinople, or Damascus. The House System is designed to create a sense of community, foster camaraderie, and provide opportunities for leadership and growth.

Each house seeks to win the house cup at the end of the year by accumulating the most house points. House points are awarded for acts of virtue to individual students and to houses for winning weekly competitions. Not only does the winning house receive a prize for being victorious, but the student with the most individual points at the end of the year also receives a prize.

Volunteer Clearance

Whether you volunteer as a mystery reader, a field trip chaperone, or anything in between, all volunteers must clear Level 2 training in order to engage with volunteering at Atlanta Classical. To gain clearance, volunteers must watch two training videos and complete a Google form about what you learned. The process should take 15 minutes or fewer to complete.

Once you have watched both videos and completed the form, you will be cleared to perform supervised volunteering on and off campus.

Infinite Campus	Parents can access their student's class schedules, attendance records and grades; and update their contact information through Infinite Campus, Atlanta Public School's (APS) student information and communication system.
SchoolMint	SchoolMint is the online enrollment platform the school uses for the lottery application and the annual re-enrollment process for all students. It is also where medical forms and health history forms are found.
ParentSquare	A communications app where teachers communicate with their class and parents. The school will send reminders and communicate gradespecific information.
MyPaymentsPlus	Payment system for meals, fees and activities.
PRIVIT	Prior to athletic tryouts, parents must complete all forms and waivers, and have an updated physical on file through PRIVIT. No hard copies will be accepted.
Mr. Andrew's Weekly Zoom Call	Head of School, Mr. Andrew, hosts a weekly Zoom call relaying important updates in the life of the school.
Direct Email	Direct school correspondence in the form of email from school personnel to parents.
Legenda and Chronicle	The Legenda is a weekly, forward looking email highlighting all- school news and upcoming events. The Chronicle is a monthly email that reflects on significant events and stories from our school community.
TeamSnap	Once a student-athlete joins an ACA team, parents will be added to TeamSnap for communication regarding practices, schedules, and more.
