Review Meeting Norms (AEIOU)

Review and Approve Minutes

Group reviewed norms and minutes. Sabalone asks for any corrections. No corrections.

Suzanne motions to approve, Sabrina seconds. Motion passes.

State of the School ~ Shannon Driskell

- a. Academics~ Summer school update (Annie Petrie): Refers to ULHS website/announcements for summer session document. Reviews first outreach for parents and students who need credit recovery. Piloting Cyber High to connect to teachers and tutors with great feedback from students. Edgenuity has been implemented by Mr. Sturr and needs commitment from parents and students to continue. College courses through Mendocino college are robust summer courses as of now. A 3 unit college class counts as 10 high school units. Upward Bound students also have opportunities through summer school college courses. Incoming eighth graders will be greeted August 2-6 to get them connected and engage with the help of student ambassadors.
Petrie will follow up about incoming Freshmen taking college courses during the summer prior to starting high school.
Radie Krueger gives an update on students' improvements with state testing and increasing skills to do so.
Intern assessment blocks update from Dana Adams (LCOE) and the motivation from students with end-of-the year testing.

- b. Activities~ Annie Petrie shows how the ULHS website works for resources for Senior students. Celebrations are now able to take place and this Friday will be the first of its kind for this year. No matter what the students' next steps are they will be celebrated. This Saturday is Senior formal dinner (May 1), awards night is May 19, and Senior picnic May 25. Graduates are able to have 4 guests per graduate as of now. Graduation will take place May 28th. Tiffany Hunter shares the fundraiser being put on by Sara Sanchez and Melanie Sneathan. Amber Hoffman shares that students need to be celebrated and Annie Petrie shares that there are celebrations in the works for each grade level on May 19th. Anna Sabalone and Shannon Driskell share about their walk to the levee on Earth Day.
- c. Arts~
- d. Athletics~Spring sports: Cross country was well represented by Upper Lake and hosted two meets. Track and Field followed right after and is a great opportunity for any student. Next meet is tomorrow and the program is being built. Baseball and softball are in full swing. This is the first step to getting back to athletics. North Shore Youth Club is creating multiple types of clubs, sports, and cheer. Some of those may include photography, fishing, English, etc.

Public Input

Amber asked about the last day of school. Annie Petrie explained the difference between the sites.

Kauble gives an update on funding: long-term planning is taking place for spending money for the next three years. Restrictions vary from fund to fund, reporting is required, and learning loss is the focus. Budget kicks into gear at the beginning of May when the Governor announces COLA, affording staffing, curriculum, etc. Covid caused a lot of stress on the economy/budget. Annie Petrie asks about the effect on site council specifically. Kauble states it's a 27 month term (SPSA). Money is spent with the help of input from the site council. Food service program is providing meals at no cost due to the high number of students that are low income. Annie reiterated that our site council needs to keep alignment for these aspects of funding. ULHS is trying to build a more robust team to meet the goals and needs of ALL of our students. Suzanne asks about SPSA being on our website and Annie Petrie states that it is for last year.

Expanded Learning Opportunities Grant Plan: Kauble states we are receiving this money for mitigating learning loss. Must be board approved. Describes the breakdown of the plan.

Annie Petrie refers to the section that focuses on the ease of the school website. Teachers will be able to step in as extra support. Learning hubs will help with learning loss. Anna Sabalone asks if the amount listed is requested or allotted. Kauble states that it is the allotted amount for the district and has not yet been received. There is no breakdown yet of how it will be split between the sites.

Annie Petrie shares that consideration is being given to engagement and thinking outside the box to rehook our kids into learning and building for a future. Kauble states that each site is getting funding from additional sources of funding. \$769,000 was funded to the district in July and had to be spent by December, which eventually was pushed to May 2021. Anna Sabalone asked for Kauble to show her the website for the district and required postings. Plan needs to be approved by board before being posted on the district website. Annie Petrie states that we should include the LCAP on ULHS website.
