



Athletics Tutor

A part-time, competitively paid position at a first-rate college preparatory school for boys.

The **Athletics Tutor** supports high school students participating in the school's competitive Warrior Athletics Program with achieving success in college and beyond by reviewing the concepts and skills covered in students' academic courses; enhancing student' study skills; and helping students with balancing the responsibilities of being both a student and an athlete. The Athletics Tutor will report to the Director of Athletics and work closely with students' coaches, teachers, and parents.

The tutor will perform the following duties:

- Provide individual or small group tutoring to assigned student-athletes. Tutoring sessions are two days a week for one hour a day. The days and hours are Mondays and Wednesdays from 3:15pm to 4:15pm, and Tuesdays and Thursdays from 4:15pm to 5:15pm.
- Establish and maintain rapport with assigned student-athletes.
- Meet with assigned student-athletes on a weekly basis to assist them with building understanding of specific subject material and improving academic capabilities in designated areas.
- Help student-athletes develop the study skills necessary for academic success.
- Maintain reports and accurate records of sessions and progress of assigned student-athletes.
- Enforce the code of conduct and serve as a culture keeper of the Boys' Latin mission.

The tutor will demonstrate the following competencies:

- Unwavering commitment to the school's mission of preparing boys for success in college and beyond.
- Desire to continuously learn and increase effectiveness as a professional to drive results among students.
- Willingness to be flexible and go above and beyond to meet the needs of all students.
- Ability to cultivate strong relationships with all members of the school community, including students, parents, faculty and staff members, administrators, and external partners.
- Bachelor's degree.

Learning is underscored by practical experiences and extracurricular activities. Over the past decade, the school has built an effective model for educating students historically underserved in traditional school settings. Since the first class graduated in 2011, Boys' Latin students have matriculated to and persisted through college at rates three- to four-times greater than Philadelphia averages.
