REPORT OF ADMINISTRATIVE DIRECTOR: Attachment #1 supplemental minute book

- 1. CTC enrollment for 2016-2017 currently stands at 223 AM students and 377 PM students for a total of 600. Approximately 174 Senior students will be leaving and approximately 330 new students have been admitted for 2017-2018.
- 2. CTC Student of the Month for April is Ryan Doherty, a senior from Carbondale Area High School in the Service Occupations Program. Ryan comes every day ready to work and stays focused on his tasks. Ryan does an exceptional job in his co-op position working with the CTC maintenance staff. He exemplifies what a hard working and determined individual is. In his spare time, Ryan enjoys football and building model cars. After graduation he will be attending Hiram G Andrews Center and Commonwealth Technical Institute.
- 3. CTC student of the month for May is Isabel Lopez, a junior from Holy Cross High School, in the Computer Systems Technology Program. Isabel is always looking for a challenge, and eager to learn new concepts. At Holy Cross, Isabel competed in the Pennsylvania Junior Academy of Science, is the vice president of the pro-life club, and is on the yearbook staff. She recently won third place while competing for CTC at the Northeastern Educational Intermediate Unit's regional computer fair for design. After high school Isabel plans on obtaining her Bachelor's Degree in Computer Forensics.
- 4. The PSBA regional Town Hall meeting was held at CTC on May 15th. Approximately 20 local board members and superintendents attended.
- 5. Ms. Ikeler hosted a College/Union fair for CTC juniors and seniors on May 4th. Seventeen groups were represented. The Carpenter's Union participated in the fair and donated a set of new textbooks to the carpentry program saving CTC considerable money.
- 6. Mr. Kyle Linko, Welding Program Instructor was awarded the Howard E. Adkins Memorial Instructor District Award as Welding Teacher of the Year by the Lehigh Valley Section of the American Welding Society for the second year in a row.
- 7. The Cosmetology "Total Look" competition and show is being held this evening at CTC.
- 8. Five Seniors in Cosmetology have successfully completed their state boards, an additional five have completed their hours and have state board exams scheduled and an additional three are still working on completing their hours.
- 9. HOT Blood Drive collected 35 units with 53 potential donors presenting and met their scholarship requirement. Donated scholarship funds are used by the HOT students to offset the cost of their CNA licensing exams.

- 10. 2017 NOCTI written test results have been received and are being analyzed. ALL programs had class averages above the state Competent level; all but 3 programs had class averages above the state Advanced level. Five programs had class averages above 80%. Mr. Linko's Welding class had the highest average of 82%. Congratulations to all of our seniors and their instructors for their hard work and success.
- 11. The PDE Approved Program Evaluation was completed in March. CTC received six citations and five commendations. The citations were all very minor and all paperwork items. The commendations were for our work on improving Occupational Advisory Committees, Mentor Program, Professional Development, Data Analysis (Performance Indicators) and Local Advisory Committee efforts.
- 12. Building Mechanics Trades students constructed and set up a scent wall for the Scranton Police Department canine unit to use for training.
- 13. Service Occupations visited the Lowe's Distribution Center on May 5 with their Teacher and Lab Assistant.
- 14. 34 Student Ambassadors visited the 9/11 Memorial on a Leadership Trip organized by Ms. Ikeler.
