# REPORT OF ADMINISTRATIVE DIRECTOR: Attachment #1 supplemental minute book

- 1. CTC enrollment currently stands at 672.
- 2. Kayla Reed, a Health Occupations Technology senior from Scranton High School is the CTC Student of the Month for November. Kayla is a Certified Nurse Aide and has been overcoming some very challenging situations in her life while maintaining good grades and excellent performance at her co-op placement. Kayla received a 95 for the first quarter for co-op and her employer performance reviews have been stellar. In addition to working two jobs, Kayla has assumed the role of primary caregiver for her siblings. Kayla participated in the CTC Blood Drive, has been nominated for NTHS, is enrolled in the Penn. College Now dual enrollment program and plans to attend college to become a Physician's Assistant after graduation.
- 3. CTC was awarded a Competitive Equipment Grant from the Pa. Dept. of Education of \$16,733. This grant will be used for two welders for the Welding program and a press tool for the Plumbing program. This is a matching grant and Capital Reserve funds will be used for the match.
- 4. CTC's Practical Nursing program held their 84<sup>th</sup> Commencement exercise on December 6. 28 New nurses were pinned.
- 5. CTC is applying for a PA Smart Pre-Apprenticeship grant proposing to develop an approved, registered pre-apprenticeship program for Automotive Service Technicians. Mrs. Stepanovich is preparing that grant.
- 6. Gibbons Ford, in conjunction with Ford Motor Company, donated a 2012 Ford Focus to the Automotive Repair program for use by students in the lab. WNEP sent a crew and filmed the event and interviewed instructors and students.
- 7. Regional SkillsUSA competitions have completed. CTC won 19 Gold, 15 Silver, and 12 Bronze medals. A complete listing with student names and sending schools has been provided to Directors and Superintendents.
- 8. Parent portal letters were sent with progress reports. The CTC Parent Portal is now open for all CTC students.
- 9. Santa's Snippers raised \$2600 in client services and over \$10,000 with corporate sponsors included. This community service project benefits the Women's Resource Center
- 10. Cookies for Kids' Cancer raised over \$6000 for a local student battling leukemia and approximately an additional \$6000 for the national charity.
- 11. Kadin Hazleton, Mid Valley is one of the first sophomore students to earn his OSHA 10 certification this year in welding.
- 12. Ms. Menichini is super excited to announce that Grace Wallo, a senior at Mid Valley School District, passed her "early bird" Cosmetology exam.
- 13. Students in Digital Communications and Commercial and Advertising Design visited Kings College to shadow communications students and learn about the new articulation agreement opportunities.
- 14. Santa and his elves visited the CTC Masonry shop yesterday and posed for pictures by the annual brick fireplace with the preschool students from the Head Start program.
