Principal Jessica Hess talked about activities planned for March Literacy Month. Students will have the opportunity to earn tickets and daily prizes. An end of the month, a Literacy Night celebration is planned for students and families to attend. Superintendent, Dr. Wendy Butler spoke about NCRERN, Harvard Initiative Program. She talked about the importance of students having a post-secondary plan. Dr. Butler updated the Board on this month's NYSCOSS Conference. She said all New York state school are focusing on the same things that we as we move away from the restrictions and challenges of the last two years. Dr. Butler noted that the upgrade to

our fire alarm system is 60% complete with initial delays caused by parts availability.
