Monica Arnold spoke on behalf of the Belfast Public Library. She provided information on the proposed budget for 2016-17 reflecting a 1.64 percentage increase in property taxes and a 5.69 percentage increase in the budget.

Library

President Hull called for nominations for the Belfast Town Library Board of Trustees for the expired term of Monica Arnold. Monica Arnold nominated Cecy Curcio. Eva Heaney seconded the nomination. There were no other nominations, thereby Cecy Curcio's name will appear on the ballot for Library Trustee at the May 17, 2016 budget vote and election. Carried

Robert Lingenfelter presented the proposed budget of \$9,386,906 for the 2016-17 school year. The budget represents a 3.15 percentage increase in spending and a 2.44 percentage increase in the tax levy. Three propositions to be voted on were presented: the Belfast Central School budget, a proposition for bus purchase, and the Belfast Public Library budget.
