At 6:30p.m., President Hull called the meeting to order.

Motion by Cecy Curcio, seconded by Janine Preston, that the Board of Education of the Belfast Central School upon the recommendation of the Superintendent approve the minutes of the May 9, 2017 budget hearing, and the May 17 and June 5 special meetings. Carried 7-0

Melanie Miller presented a gift to President Richard Hull from the Belfast Central School community in sincere appreciation for the many years he has served the school. On behalf of the Board of Education and Belfast Central School Community, Janine Preston presented Mr. Hull with a plaque. With gratitude, Ms. Preston spoke of the dedication and time that Mr. Hull has given to this school and community. Mr. Hull humbly accepted these gestures, and thanked everyone present.

Robert Lingenfelter provided budget status and revenue status reports and April warrants to the Board for review. He also provided the Board with the Annual Reserve Fund Summary, and explained each line in the reserve including its established purpose, how it is spent, and guidelines for future transfers to each fund. Mr. Lingenfelter communicated to the Board the importance of establishing reserve funds, and said that each fund is established based on yearly spending patterns, is used strictly for its established purpose, and requires board approval. Reserve fund categories include: Employee Benefits Accrued Liability Reserve, Worker's Compensation Reserve, Reserve for Retirement Contributions, Unemployment Reserve Fund and Repair Reserve Fund.

The Board established the aforementioned reserves and approved funding all reserves at various levels.

Mike Roche let the Board know that the Senior Prom, held at the Wellsville Country Club, was well attended. He stated the Country Club was very accommodating to our students, and created an enjoyable and memorable night for all. Mr. Roche said that while this venue provided outstanding service, next year's prom may move to a different location due to cost. He updated that the Baccalaureate was held on June 11, and a computer based trial was held for state tests. Mike Roche mentioned teachers who work on keyboarding with students, but noted this is an area of concern should computer based testing be required in the future.

Anne Histed expressed to the Board what a wonderful time 22 seniors had on their trip to New York City. Ms. Histed stated that she received compliments from folks along the way about how well behaved BCS students are. Ms. Histed numerated the events seen, experiences had, and memories brought home by the Belfast Senior Class of 2017. Ms. Histed informed the Board that the Accord Afterschool program would be ending due to the loss of funding. She explained the late bus, paid for by the Accord Corporation, would now be funded by Literacy West. This change ensures other activities (Study Center, Kid's Club, etc.) would still be available to BCS students.

Jim Schneider communicated to the Board that the gymnasium floor is moving along on schedule. Materials for completion of the floor are expected to be delivered approximately the third week in June. He stated work on the upper athletic field is also on schedule. Mr. Schneider recommends that some material being replaced during construction, be saved and repurposed for other projects.

- approve funding the Repair Reserve Fund in an amount not to exceed \$30,000.
- approve funding the Employee Benefits Accrued Liabilities Reserve (EBALR) Fund up to \$450,000 pending the reserve amount of funds remaining in our unappropriated fund balance as of June 30, 2016.
