
From the desk of Mrs. Hess, PK-4 Principal

Happy New Year!!! I hope everyone has had a nice holiday that included time to relax and do some fun activities together with your children. Belfast students have been working hard to learn many different writing genres throughout the first part of the school year. Writing is a critical skill for our students to have in order to be able to communicate effectively. Like reading, children strengthen their writing skills over time with practice.

For the month of January, work with your child to complete the writing calendar that is included in this article. If you are the parent of some of our littlest writers, have them

draw a picture and dictate a sentence or story for you to write. They can also label their pictures, which is the beginning stage of writing. If you have some older elementary writers at home, think grades 2-4, encourage your child to challenge themselves by writing more, adding additional details, or to use some of the authors crafts that their teachers have taught

For each row your child completes, they can earn a PAWS ticket from me for Working Toward Success. If your child completes the entire sheet, they can pick out of my prize box! Feel free to use the copy in the newsletter or have your child stop by my office or ask their teacher for a copy. I hope this will jump start your commitment to making writing a daily activity in your home!



IMPORTANT Attendance Reminder

Please remind your child that they are required to be IN first period class at 8:05 a.m.

Note that excused and unexcused Absent, Tardy, and Early Dismissal dates are documented. At the end of each quarter a letter will be sent home with report cards to inform parents of attendance dates. Excuses are required in order to change "A"=(Absent) to "E"= (Absent Excused), and "T"= (Tardy) to "L"=(Tardy Excused). Excuses should be sent in within 24 hours of returning to school. A list of excused absences is in the student handbook.

When a parent request is made for a student to be excused early for a Doctor/Dentist/Ortho/Counseling/Professional visit, a note from the professional's office should be turned in to the school within 24 hours of returning to school. You may also request doctor's notes be faxed to 585-365-2648. You do not have to take your child to a doctor to have an illness excused. A note stating that your child is ill, briefly tell why (symptoms), with a signature and dates of absence is still an acceptable excuse.

All students will enter the building through the cafeteria door. We are asking that parents drop students off in the parking lot behind the school. Please remember that students should not be in the building before 7:45 AM.

Sign in/out Procedure for all Students

- Parents and guardians must personally sign their children in and out.
- All parents and guests to the school will need to have a picture ID to enter the building, which will be scanned.

When should I wash my hands? The answer is all the time!

- After using the restroom
- Before eating. Or handling food
- After sneezing or blowing your nose
- After handling garbage
- After touching someone who is sick

Hand washing is very important to stop the spread of germs and viruses.

WHEN TO KEEP A CHILD HOME WITH ILLNESS

It can be hard to know when to send children to school if they tell you that they do not feel well. Usually, the best place for them is in school, but there are some times when keeping them home to rest or call for an appointment with your health care provider is recommended.

Please keep your child home and/or contact your child's doctor for:

- Fever greater than 100.4° (taken by mouth)
- Vomiting and/or diarrhea within the last 24 hours
- Severe sore throat along with fever and feeling ill for more than 48 hours, or after exposure to Strep throat infection
- Honey-crusted sores around the nose or mouth or rash on other body parts
- Large amounts of mucous (liquid) from their nose, with face pain or headache
- Severe ear pain or fluid coming from the ear
- Severe headache, especially with fever

If your child has a fever, it is not a good idea to give them medicine like Tylenol or Advil and send them to school, because as soon as the medicine wears off, the fever may return and you will be called to come and pick up your child

We have had an increase of stomach bug and strep. Please assess your child before sending them; as both of the bugs are very contagious. Please keep children home for 24 hours after the fever ends or they have completed 24 hours of medication if prescribed by your health care provider.



If you find your child is frequently asking to stay home from school, if they are falling behind or appear anxious about school, or if there does not appear to be any physical symptoms, contact your school nurse and your health care provider to discuss your concerns.

Remind children to throw away used tissues, cover their mouths when they cough or sneeze, keep their hands away from their face, and to wash hands often with soap and warm water. This will help keep everyone healthier.

Simply go online to fsaid.ed.gov to obtain your FSA ID. This serves as your electronic signature! Then go to fafsa. gov and begin filling out the financial information. There is information that applies to the STUDENT and a separate set of information for the PARENT. Make sure you are working on the right section! If you list at least one school in New York state on your FAFSA, you will be eligible to apply for NY State aid using the TAP application which you will be directed to at the end of the FAFSA.

Financial aid for the 2020-21 school year (this year's seniors) is based on your 2018 income taxes, so there is no need to wait until the Spring to apply. Apply now!! If students need help with applications or financial aid, please see Mrs. Heaney in the Guidance Office!




