


Seussical the Musical

From the desk of Mrs. Hess, PK-4 Principal

Dear Parents and Guardians,

This year we have decided to replace our traditional K-4 quarterly awards ceremonies with an opportunity for our students to STOP, DROP, & CELEBRATE! their work. We will provide them with opportunities to work towards goals that will be more aligned with our curriculum, allow our students to strengthen their growth mindsets, and create a more trauma sensitive environment. During a traditional awards ceremony, we call names for students to come up and receive a paper certificate for various categories, including academic subjects and special classes. These awards had varying and loosely set criteria and many times we found the same students receiving awards. We found these ceremonies had little effect on motivation throughout the quarter and in some cases left students feeling defeated.

To motivate and engage ALL students, we will designate 4 days (11/21, 2/14, 4/30, 6/25) this school year for students to STOP, DROP, & CELEBRATE! their learning. Each student will choose one piece of work that demonstrates their achievement of that quarter's goal to share with their class and other classes throughout grades K-4. On these dates, student work will also be highlighted on the BCS Facebook page for parents and community members to see. This way, all parents can share in the celebration without having to change work, sleep, or childcare schedules and arrangements.

For our celebration on 6/25, parents and family members will be invited into school to view student work as they share their personal successes from the year.

Our goals for the STOP, DROP, & CELEBRATE! days will be as follows:

- Quarter 1: Overcoming Challenges
- Quarter 2: Kindness
- Quarter 3: Working Toward a Goal
- Quarter 4: Personal Success

By celebrating student work in this manner, we hope to achieve the following:

- Every student is celebrated
- Students are given an opportunity to take ownership and pride in what is displayed
- Students get to see genuine work samples and expectations of their peers
- All parents get to share in the celebration
- We will be able to build a culture of mutual celebration and uplifting of peers

FAFSA It's never too early!

Seniors should be well underway in the college application and financial aid process! Filling out the FAFSA is easier than ever thanks to the IRS data retrieval tool! Simply go online to fsaid.ed.gov to obtain your FSA ID. This serves as your electronic signature! Then go to fafsa.gov and begin filling out the financial information. There is information that applies to the STUDENT and a separate set of information for the PARENT. Make sure you are working on the right section! If you list at least one school in New York state on your FAFSA, you will be eligible to apply for NY State aid using the TAP application which you will be directed to at the end of the FAFSA.

Financial aid for the 2020-21 school year (this year's seniors) is based on your 2018 income taxes, so there is no need to wait until the Spring to apply. Apply now!! If students need help with applications or financial aid, please see Mrs. Heaney in the Guidance Office!

Times are tough and money is in short supply for many.


