#### **Bringing Restorative Practices to Belfast**

Over the next several months, you will hear more and more about restorative practices. Please note that this is not a program that we will adopt and try to live through the next three years when it is replaced with another 'program'. With our emphasis on relationship building, teaching and supporting the development of empathy, and establishing relationships with all students, restorative practice implementation is the next logical step to involve everyone in our District in implementing practices to establish the climate/ culture we want at BCS.

The premise of restorative practice implementation is that students need to be explicitly taught how to express, manage, and solve issues. Restorative practices empower students to work together to discuss their concerns in a small (mediated) group to solve social issues. Students need to learn to express themselves effectively and how to listen to understand another person's thoughts and feelings. The ultimate goal is to teach students life-long skills that they will need in the work force or in college after graduating from BCS.

Our initial work as a District will focus on teaching the adults in the District how to foster relationships with kids and how to help students become problem solvers. There will be a 1:00 p.m. dismissal for all students on January 18, 2019 to provide professional development to BCS teachers as an initial overview of restorative practices. Additionally, teachers, staff, and administrators will participate in training to fully implement restorative practices in the 2019-20 school year.





# IMPORTANT Attendance Reminder

Please remind your child that they are required to be IN first period class at 8:05 a.m.

Note that excused and unexcused Absent, Tardy, and Early Dismissal dates are documented. At the end of each quarter a letter will be sent home with report cards to inform parents of attendance dates. Excuses are required in order to change "A"=(Absent) to "E"= (Absent Excused), and "T"= (Tardy) to "L"=(Tardy Excused). Excuses should be sent in within 24 hours of returning to school. A list of excused absences is in the student handbook.

When a parent request is made for a student to be excused early for a Doctor/Dentist/Ortho/Counseling/Professional visit, a note from the professional's office should be turned in to the school within 24 hours of returning to school. You may also request doctor's notes be faxed to 585-365-2648. You do not have to take your child to a doctor to have an illness excused. A note stating that your child is ill, briefly tell why (symptoms), with a signature and dates of absence is still an acceptable excuse.

### Nurse's Corner

Happy New Year! I hope it brings everyone good health and happiness!

With the start of a new year, it is a good time to begin eating healthy and encouraging more fruits and veggies in your kids' diet. Here are some ways to help:

We all know that eating fruits and vegetables is important. But how do you get kids to eat more of these foods?

#### **Tips for Parents:**

- Provide fruits and vegetables as snacks. Keep fruit washed, cut up and in plain sight in the refrigerator.
- Serve salads more often. Get prewashed, bagged salad at the grocery store. Teach your child what an appropriate amount of salad dressing is and how it can be ordered on the side at restaurants.
- Try out vegetarians' recipes for spaghetti, lasagna, chili, or other foods using vegetables instead of meat.
- Include at least one leafy green or yellow vegetable for vitamin A such as spinach, broccoli, winter squash, greens, or carrots each day.
- Include at least one vitamin C rich fruit or vegetable, such as oranges, grapefruit, strawberries, melon, tomato, and broccoli each day.

- Add a fruit or vegetable as part of every meal or snack. For example, you could put fruit on cereal, add a piece of fruit or small salad to your child's lunch, use vegetables and dip for an after-school snack, or add a vegetable or two you want to try to the family's dinner.
- Be a role model—eat more fruits and vegetables yourself.

#### **More Things You Can Do:**

- Be sure your child is getting the recommended amount of fruits and vegetables each day. Visit choosemyplate.gov to find out how much of each food group your child should be getting.
- When shopping for food, start in the area of the store where they keep fresh fruits and vegetables. Stock up. That

- way you know you always have some on hand to serve your child.
- Avoid buying high-calorie foods such as chips, cookies, and candy bars.
   Your child may not ask for these treats if they are not in sight.
- Limit or eliminate how much fruit juice you give your child and make sure it is 100% juice, not juice "drinks."
- Eat as a family whenever possible. Research shows that kids eat more vegetables and fruits and less fried foods and sugary drinks when they eat with the entire family.

#### Remember...

By choosing health-promoting foods, you can establish good nutritional habits in your child that will last for the rest of his or her life.

Please, if you haven't already, return your child's dental forms as soon as you can. The dental clinic will be coming soon!








# **THANKS**
