Attention Juniors: SATs and ACTs are important tests for college bound students. Any Junior who is thinking about the possibility of college should plan to take one or both of these tests. College entrance exams are one piece of information that many colleges look at when considering students for admission. Other considerations include: grades, course selection, class rank, activities, community service and recommendations.

Students must register online to take these tests. See Mrs. Heaney for help or for more information. Keep the following dates in mind.

The test fee is \$47.50 for the SAT without the essay test and \$64.50 for the test with essay. Fee waivers are available for qualified students.

# **Building Project Update**

With the approval of the Capital Project in October, it is important to keep our community as informed as possible on the progression of the project. Currently, the project is in the 'design phase,' which means BCS staff and members of the Clark Patterson Architecture firm are collaborating with stakeholder groups (teachers, BOE members, office staff, etc.) on every facet of the project to address the needs of the District. Critical items for each group are addressing safety and security, the functionality of every space, and the needs of our students.

#### A general timeframe for the project is below:

- November 2018-June 2019: project design phase
- <u>June 2019-August 2019:</u> project submission to SED for review and approval
- <u>Fall 2019:</u> bidding period for work to be completed during the project
- Spring 2020: construction to begin as early as possible
- August 2020: construction to be completed before school opens for the 20-21 school year

We will be working with everyone to limit the number of disruptions to the normal functions of BCS, and we will try to communicate changes as soon as possible with the community. Please continue to check our web page for updated information.


# IMPORTANT Attendance Reminder

Please remind your child that they are required to be IN first period class at 8:05 a.m.

Note that excused and unexcused Absent, Tardy, and Early Dismissal dates are documented. At the end of each quarter a letter will be sent home with report cards to inform parents of attendance dates. Excuses are required in order to change "A"=(Absent) to "E"= (Absent Excused), and "T"= (Tardy) to "L"=(Tardy Excused). Excuses should be sent in within 24 hours of returning to school. A list of excused absences is in the student handbook.

When a parent request is made for a student to be excused early for a Doctor/Dentist/Ortho/Counseling/Professional visit, a note from the professional's office should be turned in to the school within 24 hours of returning to school. You may also request doctor's notes be faxed to 585-365-2648. You do not have to take your child to a doctor to have an illness excused. A note stating that your child is ill, briefly tell why (symptoms), with a signature and dates of absence is still an acceptable excuse.

#### Happy February! And greetings from the School Nurse!

I hope everyone is staying warm, and enjoying the New Year!

I thought since we just had the dental clinic we would talk about dental care.

# February is National Dental Health Month!

Lifelong habits begin at home. Make dental health part of your daily routine and share these reminders with your whole family:

- © Brush your teeth at least twice a day with fluoride toothpaste, especially after breakfast and before bedtime. Drinking water after eating also helps to clear your teeth of food particles.
- © Floss every day. An adult should help children under the age of eight to floss. Older children should be ready to floss on their own.
- © Limit the number of times you eat snacks, especially the sticky ones and long lasting ones.
- © Visit a dentist regularly for a routine check-up and a cleaning.
- © Protect your teeth by wearing a mouth guard when playing sports.
- © Don't forget to change your tooth brush regularly, and after an illness

#### Sweet snack facts:

Eating a lot of snacks with sugar may cause cavities.

Every time you eat sugar, plaque in your mouth mixes with the sugar to make acid. The acid hurts the teeth and causes decay over time. This can be painful!

Since I see a lot of nose bleeds, lets get some facts out there! Here are some tidbits for nose bleeds.

#### What causes Nose Bleeds:

The nose is a part of the body rich in blood vessels (vascular) and is located in a vulnerable position protruding on the face. As a result, trauma to the face can cause nasal injury and bleeding. The bleeding

complication. Nosebleeds occur spontaneously when the nasal membranes dry out and crack. This is common in dry climates, or during the winter months when the air is dry and warm from household heaters. The incidence of nosebleeds is higher during the colder winter months when upper respiratory infections are more frequent, and the temperature and humidity fluctuate more dramatically. In addition, changes from a bitter cold outside environment to a warm, dry, heated home result in drying and changes in the nose which make it more susceptible to bleeding. Nosebleeds also occur in hot, dry climates with low humidity, or when there is a change in the seasons.

#### **How to stop Nose Bleeds:**

- Lean forward slightly with the head tilted forward. Leaning back or tilting the head back allows the blood to run back into the sinuses and throat, and can cause gagging or inhaling of blood.
  - Spit out any blood that may collect in your mouth and throat.
     It may cause nausea, vomiting, or diarrhea if swallowed.
- Pinch all the soft parts of the nose together between the thumb and index finger.
- Hold the nose for at least five minutes. Repeat as necessary until the nose has stopped bleeding.
- Sit quietly, keeping the head higher than the level of the heart. Do not lay flat or put your head between your legs.
- Apply ice (wrapped in a towel) to the back of the neck to help slow the nose bleed.
  - ◆ When it stops remember no blowing the nose. This will restart the bleed.
  - ◆ Don't put anything in your nose (fingers, tissues) this will also restart the bleed.
  - ◆ Take it easy, relax and sit down for a bit.

IF ANY NOSE BLEED LASTS LONGER THAN 10 minutes AND IT HAS NOT SLOWED DOWN PLEASE GO TO THE ER, or CALL YOUR PHYSICIAN!








# Belfast Record Breaker




