Superintendent's Corner

It is crazy to think that the school year is coming to an end, which is a great time for reflection. Students spend roughly seven hours a day, five days a week, for forty weeks in school, which is approximately 1400 hours a year at BCS. If a student spends their entire K-12 time at Belfast, they will spend nearly 18,200 hours in our walls, before considering extracurricular activities and events. It is with this frame of mind that I am writing to update our community on the initiatives underway at BCS.

As a District, we have spent the 18-19 school year focusing on the importance and impact relationships and empathy have on student learning. When students have relationships with teachers, administrators, and other school employees, they are more likely to attend school and to work harder on their academics. Students who feel and understand empathy develop higher order thinking skills, have increased performance, and better communication skills. BCS is committed to supporting the emotional needs of students, which is why these areas are critical to the time emphasized during the school day.

Additionally, the District has spent the year planning for the capital project that was approved by the Belfast community in October. The plans have been submitted to SED for approval and construction is on track to start in December of 2019. The overall impact of the project will improve facilities for our students and community.

Lastly, our teachers have participated in numerous hours of professional development to enhance instruction and increase student academic progress. Teachers have engaged in learning opportunities and data analysis to target instruction and to develop programs to target specific student instructional needs.

The direction our District is heading in is designed to maximize the outcome of the 18,200 hours each student attends Belfast Central School. Our goal is to support the academic, social/ emotional, and physical needs of our students and staff to create an educational environment that makes everyone proud! #BCSBulldogPride

We Can Help

Food security is an increasing problem in our society. Our Home to School Coordinator attempts to offset this challenge for families each week.

Cuba Cultural Center in Cuba, NY provides us with backpack food for children each week. Boxed macaroni and cheese, cereal, juices, canned soup, peanut butter, canned tuna and canned vegetables are available for students to help families provide nutrition for their children every weekend.

In addition, local churches generously donate snacks and other food items for students.

Recently, farm fresh produce from our aquaponics program is available in limited quantities. Lettuce, swiss chard and kale may be obtained by appointment only. Occasionally, locally produced eggs are also available for families to pick up by appointment. Delivery is also an option where transportation is problematic.

Nurse's Corner

As this school year ends and summer begins remember to be safe in the sun. Make sure your kids are covered with sun protection. Every child needs sun protection. The lighter someone's natural skin color, the less melanin it has to absorb UV rays and protect itself. The darker a person's natural skin color, the more melanin it has. But both dark- and light-skinned kids need protection from UV rays because any tanning or burning causes skin damage. The American Academy of Dermatology (AAD) recommends that all kids — regardless of their skin tone — wear sunscreen with an SPF of 30 or higher. Whatever sunscreen you choose, make sure it's broad-spectrum (protects against both UVA and UVB rays) and, if kids are in or near water, is labeled water-resistant. Apply a generous amount and re-apply often.

A reminder for students that have medications, inhalers, and epi-pens in my office needs to have <u>parents pick up medication by June 26th, 2019</u>. If special arraignments are needed please contact me. And remember <u>Physicals for next year for grades Pre-K, K, 1,3,5,7,9,11 will be due 30 days after the first day of school unless you let me know there is an appointment made later</u>. Any questions please contact me. And for sports – Physicals are due every year for sports!




