Superintendent's Corner

At the Board of Education meeting on January 9, 2018, the Board passed four resolutions needed to pursue the District's purchase of the house located at 13 King St. (on the corner by the front of the school). The District has submitted a purchase offer to HUD to secure the District's interest in the property, but voter approval is required for BCS to acquire the property. The BOE set the official vote for the property purchase for March 1, 2018.

Why does the District want to buy the property? The house at 13 King St. has been vacant for some time. BCS looked into purchasing the house and property several years ago, but the price of the house at the time did not fit into the District's financial picture. The price of the property has dropped significantly.

Any vacant building can invite unappealing activities or animals that we do not want by our building for the safety and protection of our students.

What will the District do with the property if the proposition is passed by the voters? At this time, no definite plans have been developed and approved for the property site. However, the District is looking to minimally expand parking. As attendance at school events continues to climb, it is increasingly more difficult to find parking. At some point in the future, this is one potential use for the property.

I will be contacting community groups to see if BCS personnel and Board of Education members can meet with various groups to talk about the property purchase prior to the vote. DOES THE PRAISE YOU GIVE YOUR CHILD HAVE AN IMPACT?

It is not uncommon to hear an adult tell a child "Good job!" or "You're so smart!" Based on Carol Dweck's growth mindset research, these types of comments may not have the effect you desire. Carol Dweck performed an experiment with four hundred fifth-grade students from New York schools. The fifth grade students were first presented with a test featuring an easy-to-solve series of puzzles. When the puzzles were completed, the researcher gave each student one of the following two lines of praise:

"You must be smart at this." or "You must have worked really hard."

The students then had the opportunity to choose the test they wanted to take for the second round: an easy test like the first one or a much more difficult test from which, the researchers said, the student would learn a lot. Interestingly, the majority of students who were praised for being smart opted to take the easy test, while over 90 percent of the students praised for their effort chose the difficult test.

Dweck found that those children praised for their smarts believed their success/lack of success was directly linked to their intelligence. They were less likely to take on risks and challenges so as to not jeopardize the "smart" label that had been bestowed on them, moving into a fixed mindset to preserve the assessment of their intelligence. Conversely, the students praised for their effort had no such insecurities. They were able to exist comfortably in their growth mindsets where making mistakes is just a consequence of working hard and trying new things.

Quite often, teachers, parents, and even students use what Dweck refers to as "Person Praise." Person praise focuses on a student's personal traits and qualities, like intelligence. Dweck suggest that using what she calls "Process Praise" will support the growth of growth mindset traits in children. Process praise acknowledges effort, strategies, or actions that contribute to the success of a task. The next time you praise your child, try to move from giving person praise to process praise. Here are some examples to get you started:

Person Praise	Process Praise
That math homework was so easy for you.	That math homework didn't give you much of a challenge. Let's move on to something that will really stretch your brain!
You're so smart.	I like how you used different strategies to figure out these problems.
You're such a good boy/girl.	I appreciate that you cleared the table without being asked.
What an amazing soccer player you are!	Your effort during practice today shows that you are really working hard for your team.
You're a born writer.	Your writing shows that you understand the value of word choice.

Dweck also encourages the use of specific praise over vague praise. Next time you tell your child "You're awesome!" or "Good work!" try being more specific. "You're awesome!" can become "You're putting in awesome effort on this homework assignment!" "Good work!" can become "Good work on completing all your AR points before the end of the month!"

Changing the way you praise will not be easy, but the more you practice the easier it will become! Researchers in Chicago found that there are long term benefits for children who receive process praise over person or vague praise. Children who received more process praise demonstrated positive attitudes toward taking on new challenges and displayed more characteristics of growth mindset.

We know that the kind of praise we offer children can encourage fixed and growth mindsets, so it's important to be mindful of the type of praise we're offering. But according to Dweck, getting involved is even better than praise. Appreciate it. Ask questions. If we see that a child is using interesting strategies, we can ask about them. Talk to them about their thought processes, how they learn from mistakes.







Science

Students in Mrs. La Greca's science classes have been working in the lab on some interesting assignments. 9th grades in Regents Earth Science used Sling Psychrometers to obtain the dry bulb and wet bulb temperatures. They used their data to determine the dew point and relative humidity. Some students braved the cold temperatures to collect data from outside for comparison.

8th graders have been learning about all the different sources of energy. The "getting the oil out" lab has the students construct oil wells, and try to bring the oil to the surface using artificial lift. Soda and chocolate syrup represent two different types of crude oil and the challenges each one has.

Tune Into These Stations for School Closings and Delays

The decision to close school or delay the opening of school is generally reached by 6:15 a.m. and is then passed on to various television and radio stations by about 6:45 a.m. Please tune to the television and radio stations listed below. We will also be using a mass communication system. Should the school close, you will also be notified via phone, or text, or email. If you do not receive the closing information through one of these methods, please update your information with the school.

The decision to close the school may be made due to unfavorable road conditions, extreme cold and wind chill, or other variables associated with the weather and/or wintery conditions. Occasionally, when only part of the school district is experiencing poor driving conditions, only those parts will be closed to bus travel. In some instances, the bus may travel to a pick-up point that requires children to cross the road to catch the bus. If parents refuse to allow children to ride the bus for this or any reason, their decision will be respected, and in these cases, we ask that parents make arrangements to transport students to school if/when conditions improve.
