Superintendent's Corner

Community Eligibility Program

Belfast Central is excited to announce that the District is in the process of applying for the NYS Community Eligibility Provision (CEP) for the 2018-19 school year. As a school that participates in the School Breakfast and National School Lunch Programs with a high enough percentage of students who are eligible for free lunches, BCS is able to apply for the grant which will allow our students (and families) to receive a free breakfast and lunch at school. If our application is approved, the CEP will be in place for five years.

In addition, BCS will be purchasing a breakfast cart to make breakfast more enticing to our secondary students. Currently, approximately 30% of our students eat breakfast in school. One reason for the low number of students eating breakfast in school is the proximity of the cafeteria to the secondary students' lockers. Students simply do not want to walk down to the cafeteria to get breakfast. By adding a breakfast cart to our building, BCS will increase access to a nutritious start to many students' days.

Many students do not have access to nutritionally sound meals on a regular basis. We have a responsibility to help our students in all aspects of their lives, and we know students who are hungry do not perform well academically. This program is a wonderful opportunity for our school and community.

What Is Response to Intervention (RTI)?

Every child is unique and learns at a different pace. Your child's teacher is looking for better ways to support your child as they learn and grow. In order to help them do this, BCS uses a system called response to intervention, also known as RTI or AIS. During the day, each grade level has a dedicated time to support students who are struggling with material that has been taught in the classroom. Classroom teachers, as well as reading and math specialists, work together to identify students in need and match them with appropriate interventions to fill the gaps in their learning.

How do we know who needs RTI?

Approximately every six weeks the RTI committee holds meetings with each grade level. The committee is made up of administrators, classroom teachers, reading and math specialists, and related service providers. Data is used to guide the committee when deciding who needs interventions. Students who are scoring below grade level on NYS assessments, Aimsweb benchmarking, DRA assessments, and classroom assessments are then matched with an appropriate intervention to target their needs. Students with similar needs may be grouped together. Interventions can be provided by your child's classroom teacher, reading or math specialists, teaching assistants or aides (with supervision provided by a certified teacher), speech pathologist, or an occupational therapist.

What does RTI look like?

RTI can look different based on your child's needs. As a student's need increases, their RTI services will also increase. This is true in reverse as well. Once your child begins to make progress, RTI services may be decreased. While deciding what changes a student needs to have for their RTI

plan, the committee can change providers, frequency of RTI service, or the intervention that is being provided. Each child has an RTI goal for each targeted intervention. Data is collected through progress monitoring to show growth or the need for a change in the intervention plan.

What can you do as a parent?

Communicate!!! If you feel your child is struggling in an area, please talk with their classroom teacher. Ask questions - what types of interventions are being provided, what is their RTI goal, whether or not they are making progress towards their goal. The more information you have about how your child learns, the better support system you can put in place for them at home. Feel free to reach out to their intervention provider with specific questions about how they are performing during RTI time. If at any point you do not understand why your child is getting an intervention or how to better support your child towards reaching their goal, please reach out to the school.

What do owners of local vape shops, regional convenience store retailers, Roswell-Park Hospital, Allegany County Dept. of Health, Allegany Council on Alcohol and Substance Abuse, a retired teacher, the Commissioner of Motor Vehicles, Veterans Affairs, local faith based leaders and four BCS high school students have in common? All were in attendance at the April 9 public hearing in Belmont, NY for Tobacco 21 legislation.

Compelling arguments were made on both sides for passing or defeating this legislation. The resulting vote was 8 to 7, resulting in tabling the measure.

"It was really interesting and I am not sure how I would have voted if I were a legislator," said Hanah Helms. Other students attending were Junelle Shaw, Christian Lingenfelter and Tia Hale.

Earlier in April, Thayne Cobb, Aaliyah Knorr and Justin Hill recorded a radio commercial in Wellsville at 101.9 FM with students from Genesee Valley Central School. The script for the sixty second radio spot was conceptualized in support of Tobacco 21 by Home to School Coordinator, Jane Foster, with Natural Helpers students at BCS.



A Message Regarding the 2018-19 District Budget

The Belfast Central Board of Education and District Administration have worked diligently to prepare a budget for the 2018-19 school year which supports student programming and is fiscally responsible to the taxpayers in the District. The proposed budget will be presented at the annual budget hearing scheduled for 5:30 p.m. on Tuesday May 8, 2018, in room A206. The proposed budget has a -1.68% increase in the school district tax levy.

The proposed budget will bring about changes in student programs, fiscal management, facilities, and equipment maintenance. The proposed 18-19 budget

- maintains all student programs and supports new student programs such as Robotics, Lego League, and Masterminds;
- addresses District needs in reading assessments and reading instruction;
- increases services to students with disabilities within the building by creating a new 12:1:1 class in the building;
- includes funding to have the District Treasurer position returned to the District as a full-time position;
- initiates schedules to address much needed routine building maintenance such as painting and the replacement of stair treads;
- initiates an equipment maintenance schedule; and
- includes funding for a digital sign for the front of the building.

Belfast Central can make these enhancements to student programs and facilities as a result of a 5% increase in state aid, changes in special education program expenditures, and savings associated with retirements in the District.


