# Superintendent's Corner

It is hard to believe the school year is coming to an end, and how fast the 18-19 school year will get here.

We are working on a plan to reorganize our building and morning procedures to enhance security in the building. In September, all offices, except the nurse's office, will be in the hall by the gym. The greeter's desk will be moved there over the summer, and families will use that entrance if they need to pick up or drop off their students during the school day. We will also have all students enter the building through the door that goes into the cafeteria upon entrance to the building next year. This will be the only student entrance in the morning. We will have someone stationed at the door to welcome our students every day. The District will send out reminders and specific details over the summer.

Our 18-19 school budget will also bring about some much needed updates to the building that will happen over the summer. This summer will be our first year implementing an annual summer painting schedule to paint classrooms and hallways. We will also be replacing stair treads to enhance safety. A new electronic sign will replace the current sign in front of the building.

Students and staff will also be greeted with new door security on the entrances and classroom doors when they return in September. We will be installing a card swiping system in our building over the summer, with the use of remaining building project funds. The new system will provide increased security and allow the building to go into a lockdown within five seconds of initiation if needed.

The 17-18 school year has brought about many changes in the District. The community support of our school has been outstanding. I look forward to continuing to lead this District.








#### **Envirothon**

NYS requires that all students in grades Pre-K, or K, 1,3,5,7,9 and 11 get a physical within the first 30 days of the school year. Physical forms are also located on the BCS website.
