A Message from Mrs. Hess, PK-4 Principal

This year our BCS Kindergarten through Fourth Grade families will see a change in our report cards. We are continuing to utilize a standards-based report card format but are changing our grading periods from quarters to trimesters. Now, all students in Preschool-4th Grade will be running on the same grading schedule.

Why trimesters?

- Teachers requested trimesters.
- Provides more opportunities to build relationships and rapport with students before formal grade reporting.
- Gives teachers a longer window of time to provide instruction, collect and analyze data, monitor growth, and allow for reteaching and enrichment prior to formal grade reporting.
- Provides students with more time to remediate skills due to missed instructional opportunities due to Covid.
- Shifts focus to the quality of student work.
- Greater focus on student learning rather than testing.
- More time to gather information and collect evidence of student learning and gauge student needs.
- Less report card work but measuring the same amount of time able to show more progress between report cards.

Financial Aid Night! Need help paying for college? This is for YOU!



POP UP PANTRY PRE-REGISTRATION IS EASY

WHEN TO CALL THE PRE-REGISTRATION LINE

The pre-registration line opens at 7am on Tuesday, the week prior to the food distribution. This gives you 7 full days to call before the distribution date. Keep in mind, space is limited to the first 200 families.

*Calls received prior to Tuesday at 7am will not be returned. This ensures a fair process for all.



When you call you will be instructed to leave your name, phone number and the number of the families you hope to pick up for.

An ACCORD volunteer will begin returning calls on the Thursday before the food distribution.



During the call back, you will be asked to provide the zip code and ages of the family members for each family you afre picking up for. You will then be given a pick-up time and a regustration number. Your registration is then confirmed!



We ask that you arrive no more than 5 minutes early to assure a smooth and safe process for all.

When you arrive, a staff will check you in by asking for your name or registration number. You will then proceed to the food line where our amazing team of volunteers will load food into your car!

Food is supplied in partnership with Foodlink. We are never certain of the kind or quantity of each food we will recieve.


