



Book Review: A Court of Mist and Fury Written by: Chelsea Goldsmith



A Court of Mist and Fury by Sarah J. Maas is a part of the A Court of Thorns and Roses series. ACOMAF (A Court of Mist and Fury) is my favorite book out of the ACOTAR (A Court of Thorns and Roses) series. This book is my favorite because she overcame the PTSD that was breaking her down and making her miserable all the time. This book was so good, I sat and finished in two sittings! It had me wondering what was going to happen next constantly!

When Feyre, the main protagonist, broke the curse that was over Tamlin, they were Under the Mountain. While Under the Mountain, Feyre was kept prisoner and made a bargain with another High Lord that wanted to see her once a month in his court. Tamlin's charm eventually made Feyre fall in love with him but the trauma Tamlin experienced throughout his life made him violent towards Feyre. He swore he loved her and even proposed but he locked her in his mansion of a house like she was a princess who needed saving. All Feyre wanted to do was help Tamlin rebuild the cities that was destroyed by the high faerie who placed the curse on the land of Pyrthian and Tamlin.

The day Feyre was going to get married the High Lord she made a bargain with showed up, to take up that bargain. Feyre and the High Lord went to his court, which is the Night Court. Feyre was so upset when the High Lord took her, she threw her shoe at him and hit him in the back of the head! The rest of the time at the Night court she spent moping around until she was sent back to the Spring court where her soon to be husband was.

When Feyre was locked into the Spring court mansion by Tamlin, it just added another layer to her PTSD. Feyre panicked. She turned into this ball of darknesses, fire, and wind.

She was saved by The Morrigan, who was the High Lord cousin that she made a bargain with. Feyre didn't return to the Spring court after Tamlin locked her in. She stayed in the Night court with the High Lord she made a bargain with, Rhysand who she joined forces with and trained with one of Rhysands closest friends, Cassian. Feyre decided that she wouldn't be used by anyone anymore and she would be stronger than she was before. Feyre said a quote in chapter 21 that really showed she was getting stronger and she believed it. The quote is "I was not a pet, not a doll, not an animal. I was a survivor, and I was strong. I would not be weak, or helpless again. I would not, could not be broken. Tamed."

This book shows how someone can be traumatized and how they can overcome it by working through it and surrounding yourself with people who care about you. I would give this book 4.0 out of 5.0 stars because although she overcame PTSD, Tamlin is still being persistent about her coming back to the Spring court and fights with his friend, Lucien who got horribly beat. Goodreads gives this book a rating 4.6 stars out of 5.0.


