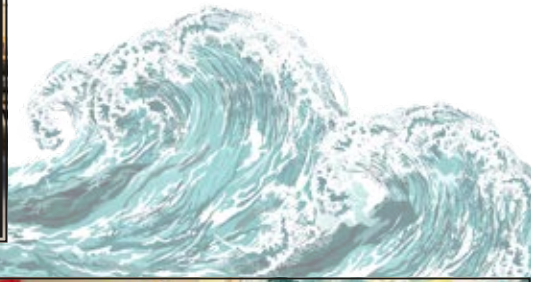
Our fourth graders had a blast learning about long division with students from Fillmore Central School at Division Day. We especially loved learning from the Houghton College students.
