A Message from Jessica Hess

It's hard to believe that we are more than halfway through this school year! As I write this, our students in grades K-8 are currently taking their winter benchmarking assessments. Students in grades K-3 take the Aimsweb diagnostic assessment in math and reading while students in grades 4-8 will take their diagnostic assessment through iReady.

Aimsweb assessments are short, often timed tests that focus on math and reading fluency skills, reading comprehension, and math application skills. Each student will have a parent report sent home identifying their child's scores for each tested area, whether their skills are above, on, or below grade level, recommendations for your child based on their performance, and information on whether your child's skills are improving.

Like Aimsweb testing, the iReady diagnostic assessment evaluates our students' math and reading skills. An iReady report will also come home which provides families with information on all growth from the fall to winter benchmarking and how their student performed in each sub-category and what the score means. All students in grades K-4 will also be assessed with the Fountas and Pinnell Benchmark Assessment System (BAS) which helps teachers identify a student's instructional reading level as well as identify areas of strength and need in their fluency and comprehension skills. It is important for families to remember that reading levels are a tool for your child's teacher to use to customize their instruction. Fountas and Pinnell advise that families help their children choose books that are of interest to them. Choosing books solely based on the book's reading level may not help engage your child in reading.

Our team of classroom, special education, and intervention teachers will analyze the data from our assessments and identify students who need remedial instruction in math and/or reading. If you have concerns about your child's performance, please don't hesitate to contact their classroom teacher or the main office. We are always happy to help explain the results of your child's assessments and next steps in order to help them continue to grow!


TOP DOG



Belfast Historical Society: A bit of history about Belfast

The town of Belfast was formed March 24, 1824 and was originally called Orrinsburgh. The name was changed to Belfast on April 26, 1825 and the suggestion of the name is said to have come from James McKeen, a native of Belfast, Maine. Mr. McKeen was an early justice of the peace in Allegany County.

The first town meeting was held April 6, 1824 and the first supervisor of the town was David Hitchcock. Settlement was begun in 1803 by three Chamberlain brothers who came from Pennsylvania. The first birth in Belfast was that of Deborah Reynolds and the first marriage was that of John Sandford to Mary Collar in 1806. Elijah Reynolds taught the first school in 1807. It is said the early settlers in the town were bothered to a great extent by the numerous bears in area forests. Rev. Ephraim Sandford conducted the first religious services in 1806, and formed the first church in 1807.

This is a brief glimpse into the early history of our town. To learn more, stop at Belfast Historical Society and Museum. You will be pleasantly surprised, I promise.




