Why we are a cell phone free environment?

- Engagement in learning!!
- Social Media Incidents: YouTube, Social Media Sites, Tik ToK
- Increase hate incidents, inappropriate content mimicked by our students
- Leads to negative interactions and power struggle

Current Cell Phone Policy

• Off and away when walk through the door (different from last year)

• First offense - Staff take the phone and send it to the office for pick up after school

• Second offense- take the phone and keep in the office for 2 weeks - notify parents.

Why are we introducing the Yondr Pouches?

- We tracked cell phone incidents from November through May of last year and there were over 400.
- This leads to negative interactions with students.
- We have piloted "shoe tree" and other alternatives with less success
- Number of cell phone and social media incidents is on the rise at Day and elsewhere post-COVID
- Direct correlation between mental health crisis and social media
- Day staff supports a cell phone free environment
- DESE grant opportunity in July to support our work.
