District Takes Steps Against Bullying

School bullying is a national problem. Approximately 20% of US students ages 12-18 experience bullying at school.

Normandy Schools Collaborative is taking proactive steps to combat bullying by creating a committee to address this issue. The committee is made up of district and school leaders and community partners, including the <u>Special School District</u>, mental health professionals, and our strategic partner, <u>Beyond Housing</u>.

Committee members held their first meeting recently. They will meet regularly to develop and implement anti-bullying policies, establish channels for students to anonymously report incidents, review and analyze data to help create anti-bullying plans, and plan initiatives to foster a culture of inclusivity and empathy at our schools. The district will conduct regular training sessions for students and staff and work with parents to reinforce the anti-bullying messages at home.


Dr. Triplett Releases New Book


