Face your feelings whether that's talking with someone or even just writing them down. Maintain your hobbies because there is comfort in routine. Look after your own health. Make sure you are eating right and getting enough sleep.

I've been checking in with those I love on how they are doing, talking with my husband and daughter, cleaning out her room as much as I'm able to, and remembering and sharing memories as they come.

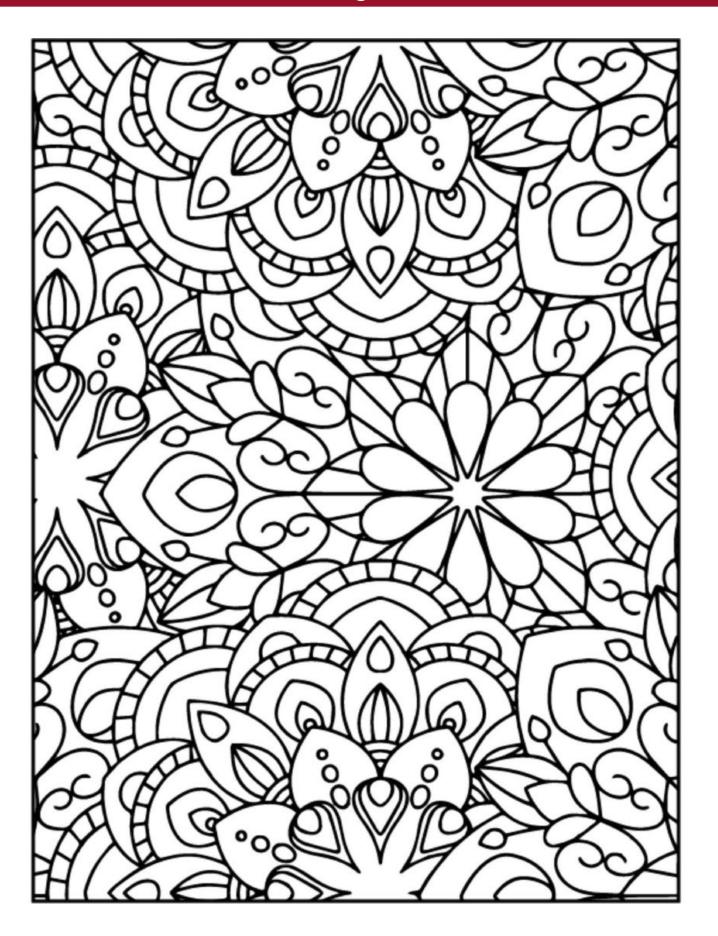
