




Kindergarten Learning Expectations

Language Arts


- Developing knowledge of letters and their sounds
- Blending sounds to read words
- Segmenting sounds they hear in words
- Identifying the beginning, middle, and end sounds of words
- Rhyming (identify and produce)
- Reading sight words independently and in text
- Reading decodable text
- Understand and respond to fiction and nonfiction stories.



Kindergarten Learning Expectations

- Count aloud to 100
- Count objects up to 100 items
- Identify numbers 0-100
- Write numbers 0-100
- Count by 5's and 10's to 100
- Add and subtract to 10
- Patterning
- Identify basic shapes and solid figures



How can I prepare my child?

- Give your child opportunities to write and draw with crayons and pencils
- Give your child opportunities to cut with scissors and use glue
- Let your child play with play dough, sidewalk chalk, etc.
- Read to your child daily
- Talk about letters and sounds
- Talk about numbers and count things



How can I prepare my child?

- Practice identifying his/her name and the letters that make up his/her name (know how to say your last name)
- Have your child help you with jobs around the house.
- If your child rides a bus, he/she needs to know bus number and bus stop. If your child does not ride a bus, he/she needs to know who is picking him/her up.
- Recite address and parent's phone number
- Have your child take responsibility for getting dressed and caring for self




Parent Responsibilities

Homework Folders

- Complete and return items from "Return to School" side
- If you have a note for us, place it in the "Return to School" side
- If you send in any money, please make sure it is in an envelope with your child's name, teacher's name or room number, and what the money is to be used for. Teachers check folders daily.






Readers' Logs


- ·Read to your child or have your child read to you




- Find the teacher contact card in your folder

What does my child need to bring to Kindergarten?

The following items, while not required, are also helpful if you would like to donate - Tissues, Wet One hand wipes, paper plates. We also have Amazon wish lists if you want to donate!










BADGE SYSTEM

Morning Arrival

Students may enter the building at 8:20 a.m. and the late bell is at 8:55 a.m.

All of our students are eligible to receive a free breakfast and a free lunch. Breakfast will begin at 8:20 am. If you would like your child to eat breakfast, please make sure to get your child to school early enough so that he/she can enjoy eating without being rushed.

Walkers and parent drop-off will enter through the Main Entrance. Bus students will utilize the bus lanes in the front and back of building.



Dismissal Procedures

At the end of the school day, walkers will exit through the door nearest to the playground. (Door 20) Parents may park in the new drop-off area or on Reno St. to walk to the kindergarten area to pick up their child.

Bus Dismissal- 3:05 p.m.




Early Dismissal



Kindergarten Student Dismissal- 11:25 a.m.


Elementary Walker Dismissal- 11:40 a.m.

Snacks


- At the beginning of each month, a snack calendar will be sent home.




PTA Membership and Clearances
