Hello Flushing Raider Families,

With our second semester successfully underway, I wanted to share some information regarding an upcoming opportunity for Flushing Community Schools. As part of the district's commitment to continuous improvement, we regularly evaluate the evolving needs in our district, and study the most efficient and economical way to address the needs that we have. With that in mind, the Flushing Community Schools Board of Education has approved moving forward with a 0 (zero) increase district-wide school improvement bond to be placed on the May 7, 2024 ballot. It is the Board of Education's hope to use this \$23.5 million bond to address the growing safety and security needs of our buildings, as well as to enhance the success of our schools' instructional, fine arts, athletic, and extracurricular programs. These enhancements will help protect our property values and continue to attract families to our great community. We are proud to be in a position where we can take on a multi-faceted project that will have such a positive impact on future generations without raising the current millage rate in our local community.



Based on our ongoing comprehensive structural and facility needs assessment, this project will focus improvements in 6 (six) different areas.

- **Safety and Security** - Updated alarm/door entry systems, additional security cameras, new secondary

entrances, as well as the installation of ballistic film in many of our entrances.

- **Instructional Technology** - Substantial investment in updated instructional technology in our classrooms, including interactive technology to aid in student learning.

- **Elementary Playground Enhancements** - With an emphasis and priority on our extensive playground asphalt needs.

- **Auditorium Updates** - Sound, carpet, stage, and possible lighting upgrades/enhancements to maintain the auditorium for our students and community.

- **HVAC Upgrades** - Areas that were not included in our last bond. Mainly air conditioning of gyms and cafeterias throughout the district.

- **Athletic Facility Upgrades** - At FHS/ FMS, including updates/substantial renovations to all current outdoor athletic

fields and tennis courts, as well as the construction of a multi-purpose outdoor stadium that will include artificial turf, a track, and newly constructed out-buildings, such as restrooms and concessions.

This will be a 0 (zero) mill increase over the current debt levy, which is due in large part to the rapidly increasing property values in our district. With past voter approval, we currently levy 3.18 mills to retire our existing facilities school improvement debt, and this bond initiative is simply seeking to continue that 3.18 millage rate debt levy, rather than asking for an increase or allowing it to decrease. While a possible increase was discussed based on the level of need, we are proud to be able to craft a project that will meet our needs without having to raise the current millage rate. Our current 3.18 millage rate, which we are seeking to simply continue, rather than raise, is well below the county average. As an example, some of the local districts current debt levy millage rates include:

- Flushing - 3.18
- Clio - 3.75
- Swartz Creek - 3.90
- Carman-Ainsworth - 4.10
- Linden - 4.19
- Fenton - 5.0
- Davison - 5.14
- Grand Blanc - 6.30
- Montrose - 7.0
- Goodrich - 7.75
- Holly - 8.5
- Brandon - 12.16
- Bendle - 13.0

A complete list of current local school bond millage rates can be found on our website. With a simple continuation of our current debt levy of 3.18 mills, the Flushing Community Schools level of debt and tax burden on our community will proudly remain significantly less than the county average.

Additional bond related information, including frequently asked questions can be found on our website, www.flushingschools.org. We will also be holding a number of community informational meetings throughout March and April so that everyone is thoroughly aware, educated, and informed. If you have additional questions or would like me to speak to your group regarding this bond, please feel free to reach out and I will be glad to help. As a reminder, school improvement millage funds are for structural enhancements and facilities and cannot be used to pay for people, salaries, or operating expenses. In a general sense, a facility bond like this one does serve to protect general fund dollars, so that general funds would not need to be used to complete any of the projects listed above. This means that more of the general fund budget can support students' needs in the classroom. As an educational institution, we strongly encourage everyone in our community to be as educated as possible and to exercise their right to vote on May 7, 2024. Thank you for your ongoing support of Flushing Community Schools, and for your partnership in helping us meet our vision of "Preparing Learners Today for Opportunities Tomorrow."

If so, please join us on Tuesday, March 19, 2024, from 5:30-6:30 pm in our preschool classrooms located in the Early Childhood Center (409 Chamberlain Street). Our preschool team of teachers has been working hard aligning curriculum with our developmental kindergarten and kindergarten teachers. Through regular curriculum meetings they designed a new phonemic awareness program for our preschool students. Throughout the school year, our preschool students build their gross motor skills by dancing, playing on the playground, and learning new skills like skipping and galloping in the gymnasium.

SUMMER LATCHKEY REGISTRATION COMING SOON!

Registration forms for the 2024 Summer Latchkey Program will be available on the district website beginning Monday, April 1, 2024. Forms will be found at www.flushingschools.org and by clicking on the Departments tab. The Summer Latchkey Program is a drop-in program and provides daily childcare and activities for children ages 3-12, Monday through Friday, 7:00 am – 5:30 pm. The program is located at the Early Childhood Center. Summer Latchkey will begin on Monday, June 10, 2024. The registration fee is \$20.00. The daily cost for the program is \$22.00 per student for a full day, or \$16.00 for a half day, under 5.5 hours of attendance. Optional field trips are offered weekly, along with water play, foam parties, nature programs, roller skating, putt-putt golf, local zoo and children's museums, bowling, cooking/art activities, ice cream, and much more. The summer program will end on Friday, August 16, 2024, with a summer dance party including a local DJ, glow sticks, face painting, and pizza lunch. 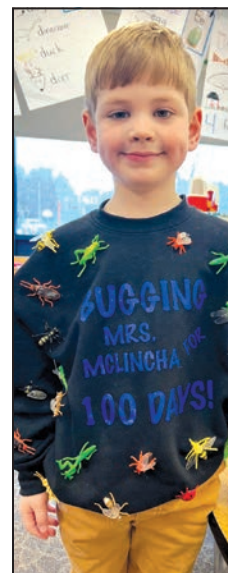

Assessment Information: Feb 2024

Spring is right around the corner, which means state testing is as well. Our school district is required by federal and state laws to administer state tests designed to provide important information on student college and career readiness as they advance towards graduation.



- M-STEP science and social studies (grades 5 and 8)
- PSAT 8/9 ELA and math (grade 9)
- PSAT 10 ELA and math (grade 10)

Grade 11 students will take the Michigan Merit Examination (MME) which has three required components:

- SAT with Essay college entrance exam - ELA and math assessment
- ACT WorkKeys work skills assessment
- M-STEP science and social studies

While the state tests gain a lot of attention, we are also required to administer the NWEA test to measure academic progress in our K-8th grade students. Students take this nationally normed test three times a year to monitor growth. Data from this assessment was sent home at the beginning of the year. You can expect to see mid-year results in early March and once again in June. Contact your child's teacher if you have any questions on this assessment.

Our English Language Learners (ELLs) began taking the WIDA test at the beginning of February and will finish up in March. Our elementary, middle and high school students will soon be preparing to take the M-STEP, PSAT, SAT and WorkKeys tests to measure how well they are mastering state standards.

All state tests are required to be administered in person in order to preserve the fidelity of the test. Student attendance and participation on these days is crucial, as every district across the state is held to the standard that 95% of our students must take the assessment each year.

Buildings will share more detailed information, but you can plan on the following testing windows:

- M-Step:** April 8th-May 17th for grades 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8 and 11.
- PSAT/SAT/WorkKeys:** April 10th-April 11th for 8th-11th grade.

Students in grades 3-10 will be administered:

- M-STEP English Language Arts (ELA) and mathematics (grades 3-7)
- PSAT 8/9 ELA and math (grade 8)

Our students work hard to perform to the best of their ability. Thank you in advance for all of the support you show during these testing windows. Whether it be supporting your children while working through the practice tests, reminding your children to go to bed early the night before, providing a good breakfast the morning of the test, or encouraging them to take their time, we know you're a part of this process, as it takes a village!

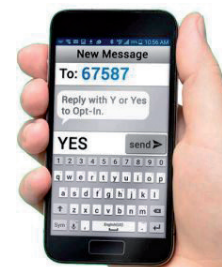
